PREK NEWS:

October has been a very busy month for our Preschool students! We started our study on trees. The children have been learning about the characteristics of trees and which animals live in trees. We also enjoyed a nature hunt where we found acorns, seeds, bugs, leaves, branches, birds, and much more! The students made their own trees from branches we found! We will be learning about what food comes from trees, the people who take care of them, how trees change, and what objects are made from trees. The students also enjoyed participating in all of our Halloween festivities at school! We also want to thank the Stillwater PTA for organizing a pumpkin patch where each student got to pick a pumpkin and decorate it with spooky stickers! SECOND GRADE NEWS:

Our second graders have been working very hard in math! We have learned many strategies to add two-digit numbers. Some examples are the break-apart strategy to add the values of tens and ones, using a hundreds chart to add tens and ones, open number lines, and even compensation! We will soon learn how to do two-digit addition with regrouping. We are so proud of our mathematicians!

FOURTH GRADE NEWS:

The fourth-grade class is consistently impressing us. Fourth graders are working hard to find evidence to support their answers. They are writing paragraphs to respond to material they have read. This week, fourth grade students began writing four-paragraph essays!! They know how to get things accomplished and still have fun. In reading, we are discussing Tiger Rising

with a profound level of maturity. Great job fourth graders! This weekend is Daylight Savings. Don't forget to change your clocks!

FIFTH GRADE NEWS:

Fifth graders are off to an exciting start to their school year. Their enthusiasm for learning has shined in their attitudes and work. Students recently finished reading the book, <u>Honus and Me</u>, by Dan Gutman. <u>Honus and Me</u> is the first book in Dan Gutman's Baseball Card Adventures Book Series. The fifth graders learned and practiced the key reading skills of character, plot, inferring, setting, summarizing and many more as they enjoyed this book. They also discovered the genre of historical fiction and learned about a great American baseball player. If they love this book, there is an entire Baseball Card Adventure book series they can keep reading.

TIPS TO HELP SUPPORT YOUR CHILD WITH MATH:

- Explore math in everyday life counting out forks to set the table, pouring from a gallon of milk, telling the time when their favorite TV program begins. When kids realize that math is all around them, they begin to relax and see its meaning in their lives.
- When helping your child, ask questions to guide them through the process, such as "Where do you begin?" "What do you need to find out?" "Can you show me in a drawing how you got the answer?"
- Encourage your child to explain their problem-solving process so you can understand their reasoning.
- It's OK to say that you don't understand a problem. It gives you an opportunity to review the lesson together to see if you've missed an important piece of information.

SIXTH GRADE NEWS:

Halloween is a little different this year for our 6th graders. They still had a nice time pumpkin picking and decorating their pumpkins in their classrooms. The trees are so beautiful in the back of the school where students take mask breaks. They are finding joy in the little things like playing in the leaves, running around to get some pent up energy out, and even an occasional game of duck, duck, goose! The students just finished learning how to write a sequel to a spooky story that we read in class! Each child recorded themselves reading on our Class Dojo, and they added them to their portfolios to share with their teacher and families!
