December 13, 2021

The Stillwater Township Board of Education met on December 13, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. in the Stillwater School All Purpose Room for a Regular Board of Education Meeting.

The meeting was called to order by Dennis DeGroat at 7:00 p.m. In accordance with the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law, the time, date and location of this meeting was provided to the New Jersey Herald, Township Journal & Star Ledger on January 5, 2021. Change of location was provided to the New Jersey Herald on September 30, 2021. Notices were posted in the Stillwater School, Town Hall, Stillwater Post Office, Middleville Post Office, Swartswood Post Office and the Stillwater School Website.

Mr. DeGroat led the flag salute. The following Board members were present: Mr. DeGroat, Mrs. Svendsen, Mrs. Williver, Mr. Franek, Mrs. Kraft, and Mrs. Galante.

Absent: Mrs. Thibault, Mrs. LoCascio and Mrs. Nothstine.

Also present were William Kochis, Superintendent, René Metzgar, Business Administrator/Board Secretary, Marissa Cramer, Principal/Supervisor of CST and Special Education/Basic Skills, and members of the public.

### PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS

Mr. DeGroat thanked Shannon and Kathleen for their service on the board. They will be greatly missed!

He also wished everyone Happy Holiday, Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

### **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

<u>Kate Teresi-1001</u> Fairview Lake Road, Stillwater, NJ- Expressed that she was disgusted to hear from her children that they were discussing COVID vaccinations in class today by their teachers. Why are teachers discussing their opinions about such a sensitive topic? She also felt this mandatory 14-day quarantine is ridiculous for the unvaccinated. Students are being quarantined multiple times this year, losing valuable educational time. Mrs. Teresi asked what the statistics are of positive cases from those quarantined for close contact? We need to look at the data, not just listen to the media. She also expressed she is sick of excuses and that we need to stop targeting the unvaccinated.

<u>Katie Scott-925</u> Fairview Lake Road, Stillwater NJ- Also agreed with Mrs. Teresi and the teachers should not be pushing vaccinations on our students.

Kylah Meo-911 Duck Pond Road, Stillwater, NJ- Mrs. Meo also said other children are saying their teachers are discussing vaccinations. She asked what are the enrollment numbers we need to keep before we start losing state funding? How many students need to unenroll before the parents take back the school? She was thankful we were able to hold a holiday concert for the students, but she saw these children just have blank stares. She could not imagine having to wear a mask all day. At what point will this end?

<u>Paul Barta</u>- 902 Owassa Road, Stillwater, NJ- Asked what is the data used to determine that we are in an "orange" zone? What are the actual numbers making us in the orange?

Mr. DeGroat reminded the public that public comment is not a time for public scrutiny or a time for back and forth. He reminded this is a time for the public to speak, we welcome the comments, but to please follow the chain of command regarding concerns. Parents should be addressing concerns first with the Principal or Assistant Principal, followed by the Superintendent, then the board.

Dr. Kochis let Mr. Barta know he would be happy to email him the information in regards to the orange zone, or meet with him to discuss any questions he had on our COVID protocols.
