

FOURTH GRADE NEWS:

Fourth grade is having a great end to the school year! Students are creating research projects on a topic of their choosing from this school year. Students are creating a presentation for this project using Google Slides and then another task of their own creation. Some students are making their own kahoots, posters, or 3D models. Students are also designing their own Mathematics board games. Once finished students will have a turn to try each classmate's game out. In Language Arts, students are finishing up our class novel "Number the Stars." We still have one last book we will read together as a class. Students are also completing end-of-the-school-year writing prompts where they discuss some of their favorite memories from the school year. Have a great summer from the 4th-grade teachers!

FIFTH GRADE NEWS:

The fifth graders have been busy solving order of operations problems and absolutely loving these problems! Most adults are familiar with the steps to solve these problems such as Please Excuse My Dear Aunt Sally, but the students are learning a new and more accurate acronym called GEMS. GEMS stands for grouping symbols, exponents, multiplication/division,

and subtraction/addition. These order of operations problems are challenging the students and getting them ready for sixth grade!

All fifth graders will be receiving a summer Math Packet as well as a Reading Packet to be completed over the summer. Students should work on these packets throughout the summer and be sure to return their work on their first day back to school. If any student loses their packets, there will be extra copies in the main office all summer long!

It has been a wonderful year and we were lucky to teach these amazing students!

SIXTH GRADE NEWS:

Sixth-grade math students completed the final math unit in their textbooks on "Data Analysis and Statistics". They learned to identify statistical questions and represent data with a histogram. They then learned about measures of center (mean, median, and mode) and variability (range). Students determined if there are outliers or if the data is symmetrical to help them decide which measures were best to represent different data sets. We are finishing out the year by learning to be financially literate. We learned and practiced these skills by following a hypothetical scenario of a recent college graduate who chooses a new job by analyzing the cost of living indexes, moving expenses, payroll deductions, calculating tax and apartment hunting costs. It has been eye-opening for students to see all that needs to be considered to make financially sound decisions and to see what adults need to consider as they earn money and pay their bills!

HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION NEWS:

On June 1st we had our annual Field Day. In the morning, the students participated in activities like California Kickball, Race to Paint, Bounce Around, Roller Racer Races, Castle Ball, and so much more. During lunch, everyone got to enjoy a hot dog and watermelon outside for a picnic-like lunch. After lunch, the students got to participate in water activities like Sponge Brigade, Water Balloon Toss, and Milk Jug Relay. They then got to sit and watch the annual 6th grade/teacher kickball game. The weather was beautiful and everyone had an awesome time. We had a great year in PE and we hope everyone has a fantastic summer!
