FAMILY MATH NEWS:

The last class of 3rd grade Family Math was held Tuesday night. Activities enjoyed by all were the Balloon Ride, Save Twenty, NIM, and Build the Highest Tower. The estimation jar was won by Alex Zwahl. We look forward to another Family Math class next year! Miss Johnson and Mrs. Knapp





SECOND GRADE NEWS:

Second graders have been learning about various ways that the earth changes. We have learned about weathering, erosion, and fast and slow changes that occur on earth such as floods and earthquakes. Second graders have also recently participated in science stations to

see how models of volcanoes, erosion, and landslides change the earth. Lastly, we have learned about the effects that people have on our planet, and how human behaviors can also change the earth we live in.

THIRD GRADE NEWS:

Third graders recently finished learning about area and perimeter. At the beginning of the unit, students participated in a hands-on activity using Cheez-Its to create a shape. Then they counted the Cheez-Its in their shape to find the area, and counted around the outside of their shape to find the perimeter! They also enjoyed learning a song to help them remember that Area = Length x Width. On Thursday, students began the next unit on fractions!

FIFTH GRADE NEWS:

The fifth graders have been busy learning all there is to know about fractions. Not only can these amazing students add and subtract fractions with unlike denominators, but these students can also now multiply and divide fractions as well. Fractions include working with mixed numbers and these students have spent several weeks mastering all these different skills! The students are also proficient at finding equivalent fractions as well as converting improper fractions to mixed numbers and mixed numbers to improper fractions. A very important higher-level skill these students have worked on is simplifying fractions. They learned that their "final answer" should always be in the simplest form!

The fifth graders are finishing their unit on the structure and properties of matter. The students have enjoyed making observations to identify materials based on their properties. Students know that matter is made of particles that are too small to be seen and that matter can go through physical or chemical changes.

6TH GRADE MATH NEWS:

Sixth graders are working to complete a unit in math about geometry. This unit is a little different from the units we have previously explored this year, as it examines the relationships between points, lines, shapes, and the space they take up. The students began the unit by exploring how a parallelogram is related to a rectangle. They decomposed parallelograms and composed a rectangle by creating a triangle and moving it to the other side. They then developed the formula for the area of a parallelogram to be the base times the height. We extended this formula to develop the formula for a triangle which is half of a parallelogram. Once students were comfortable finding the area of parallelograms and triangles, they used these formulas to find the area of irregular shapes by "taking them apart" to find the area and then "putting them back together" to find the total area. They then learned how to find the surface area of prisms and pyramids. We will use these skills and apply them to find the volume of rectangular prisms with fractional units and then we will explore "statistical analysis." This concept will be new to most students. They will learn how to find the center and variability of a data set and use that information to solve problems and make decisions.

MUSIC NEWS:

Students have been preparing for this year's Spring Concert: Music is a Treat! The concert will be held on Tuesday, May 3 rd at 7:00 pm at Stillwater School. The following groups will be performing that evening: Third Grade, Fifth Grade, Beginning Band, and Advanced Band. Please make arrangements to ensure your child's attendance and participation in this event. Every part is important! We hope you join us for a night full of singing and instruments featuring some of our favorite snacks and treats.

Performers are asked to dress nicely, trying to avoid jeans and sneakers. Beginning Band students will report at 6:15 to the cafeteria and Advanced Band students should report to the music room at 6:15. Third and fifth graders should arrive at 6:30 to their homeroom class.
