We are excited to tell you about what we are learning in fourth grade. In math, we are learning about decimals, how to multiply mixed numbers by whole numbers, how to add and subtract fractions, and much more. Did you know that you call a decimal point "and"? In ELA, we are learning about poetry and reading books like *The City of Ember, Love That Dog,* and *The One and Only Ivan.* In Science, we are learning about different types of energy, such as; motion, chemical, light, heat, sound and electrical, how energy travels, and how it is transferred. FIFTH GRADE NEWS:

Fifth graders are working on multiplying fractions and mixed numbers in math. Students learned how to reduce their answer to simplest form by dividing the numerator and denominator by a multiple of both numbers. When multiplying mixed numbers, students have to first rename it as an improper fraction in order to multiply. Continued practice with multiplication and division facts will help students when working with fractions. Students can always log in to Freckle and work on fact practice at any time!

READING INTERVENTIONIST NEWS:

Reading Nonfiction Tips:

When your child is in school, reading nonfiction will become a part of their daily routine. Your children will encounter reading books, textbooks, websites, magazines, and newspapers. Students will start to read to learn information. Here are some strategies to help your child read

nonfiction materials.

- 1. Identify key concepts- identify main idea and details
- 2. Recognize how the text is organized- chronologically order, compare and contrast
- 3. Preview and predict-look at headings and pictures and make predictions
- 4. Monitor comprehension- stop periodically and retell
- 5. Summarize- put the most important information in your own words

NJSLA TESTING- SPRING 2022:

Grades 3-6 will begin NJSLA testing on Monday, May 9th. English Language Arts units are on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday for all grades. Wednesday's ELA unit is a NJSLA field test unit. Mathematics units are on Thursday, Friday, and Monday, 5/16, for all grades. Science (Grade 5 ONLY) will be given on Tuesday, May 17, and Wednesday, May 18. All Makeup testing will begin on May 19. 


