KINDERGARTEN NEWS:

Dr. Seuss is one of our favorite authors and the kindergarten classes loved participating in all of the fun activities throughout Love of Reading Week. They especially loved having a guest reader come to the classroom to share a story with them! At this point in the year your child

should be able to read through all of their "popcorn" words with little to no diculty. Please have them keep practicing their sight words until the words just "pop" right off the page and off the tip of their tongue. In math the children have been learning about teen numbers and have successfully learned to compose and decompose them using number stories. The progress they are making is wonderful to see and they will continue to "bloom" as spring approaches.

FIRST GRADE NEWS:

First graders just finished their reader's workshop unit on non-fiction books. Throughout the unit, they learned about looking for keywords in the text as well as tackling hard words. Children enjoyed learning about different topics from butterflies to making pancakes. We celebrated the end of the unit with a reading celebration. SUMMIT AND CORE TEAM NEWS:

Our 6th grade Summit Leaders have been hard at work implementing their Action Plan to make a positive and lasting difference at our school. They have embraced our year long campaign **"Together We Can Make a Difference!"** Summit Student Leaders effectively presented their Action Plan to administration and have succeeded in implementing 2 parts of their plan. 


