# **Kindergarten News:**

Can you believe that your child's kindergarten journey is half over? Now that all of the children are very familiar with kindergarten routines and expectations, we are really working toward getting ready for first grade! The children have thoroughly practiced every letter in the alphabet and should be able to easily name all of the upper and lowercase letters as well as identify all of the corresponding letter sounds. Your child's "sound power" is the strongest and most important of all of their reading "superpowers." Mastery of the letter sounds allows the students to read and write CVC words independently. In writing workshop, the kindergarten students have shifted from writing pattern books to writing "How To" books. Each child has to write step-by-step directions that teach how to do something they already know how to do. They are using the words first, next, then, and last for the different steps in their books. They also learned detailed pictures and labels are very important in a

"How To" book. Learning to read, write, act out and solve subtraction stories has been the focus of our math lessons throughout the month of January.

## **First Grade News:**

The first grade is exploring a unit on the spinning sky. We are learning about the sun, stars, and the moon. They started by investigating shadows and recorded how shadows change throughout the day. This week the students will learn about constellations and try their hand at making their own. If you see a first grader ask them a question about the sky.

## **Second Grade News:**

Matter, Matter Everywhere!

What do squirrels' teeth and nutcrackers have in common? Second Graders recently learned that scientists solve real-world problems by looking at nature and the properties of matter. Ask a Second Grader what the three states of matter are and they will easily tell you solid, liquid, and gas. They probably won't even stop there! Children have enjoyed learning how to describe matter by properties such as color, size, texture, and weight. In a recent investigation, students were challenged to create a hat to protect them from the sun on a deserted island using only materials that were washed up onshore. Paper towels, a paper plate, and a lunch bag--which have the properties that would be best to block the sun? or absorb sweat? How does it look like our young scientists did?



## **Social Worker News:**

January 24-28 is designated in schools across the country as **The Great Kindness Challenge**. Stillwater students and staff accepted the challenge of performing as many kind acts at school and home. Our Summit Student Leaders continued to work on implementing our school-wide action plan to promote a positive school climate. This week they placed positive post-it notes on individual student desks in Kindergarten and 1st-grade classrooms to share kind words and uplifting messages.

In the month of February, with the support of our Core Team, each classroom will discuss the 6 Pillars of Character with a focus of the Caring Pillar. The Caring Pillar emphasizes compassion, gratitude, kindness, and forgiveness. Students who exemplify this Character Trait will be recognized at the end of February.

Our efforts to build social and emotional competencies in our youth can not happen without the support of our families and community partners. In honor of *The Great Kindness Challenge*, below are **Tips for Raising Kind Kids** and a **Family Checklist** attachment.

- 1. Use the language of kindness. "Would you be kind enough to help your sister with \_\_\_\_?" "Could you use kinder words to say that?" "Thank you for your kindness."
- 2. As a family, practice kindness. Discuss ways to put kindness into action. Discuss ways you can show kindness in your family, school, neighborhood, and so on.
- 3. Model kindness in word and deed. Treat children with kindness. Set an example of kindness and respect by how you treat and talk about other people outside the family. Set an example within your family by the way grown-ups talk to one another. Set the tone for uncharitable talk about other people and explain why such talk is not kind or respectful. Insist on kindness and respect in all family interactions. Correct unkind and disrespectful
- 4. behavior. "Can you kindly say that in a more respectful way?" Don't allow siblings to be unkind, disrespectful, or rude to one another. Don't allow children to be disrespectful to you, either in what they say or how they say it.
- 5. Teach kindness by giving responsibilities in family life teach the spirit of helpfulness. Research demonstrates that children who are expected to be contributing family members develop greater concern for others.




