
#### **Third Grade News:**

In science, students began learning about inherited traits, which are traits you are born with and you get them from your mom and dad. Your hair color, eye color, and height are just a few examples of inherited traits!

Many of our 6th-grade students put in extra time and effort to produce amazing original designs. Lily Harvey, Savannah Norman, Gianna Goedeke and Lincoln Hennet were our outstanding finalists in the design competition. Audrey's design has been sent to the yearbook company and will be printed on the cover of our school's yearbook.

Our 5th grade Art classes completed their Winter Birch Tree Landscape paintings this week. An understanding of Space is demonstrated by using the rules of perspective and landscape design; horizon line, background, middle ground, and foreground. The illusion of light is created with Value in shading on the tree trunks and a direction of shadow painted on the ground. This project also focuses on Form and Texture as Elements of Design while experimenting with watercolor techniques.




