Preschool News:

Do you have questions about lights?

Ask a preschooler! Stillwater preschoolers are completing their study of lights within the next week. This study has been both meaningful and exciting for our little learners! We have discussed and investigated natural vs. artificial lights, day and night, shadows, and how light is reflected or absorbed. Our classrooms transformed into darkrooms to determine, "Will the object pass the light test?" As we investigated to determine if light passes through an object, children learned vocabulary terms such as translucent, transparent, and opaque. Brilliant! Then we brought our investigations outside the classroom to explore the natural sunlight and discover shadows and how they are made. We will end the study right before break with refraction and rainbows. We are bright lights in preschool!

We have also been concentrating on experiencing the holiday season with songs and stories from different holiday traditions around the world. Learning and celebrating these traditions together is what makes this time of the year so special! We are learning kindness through giving, and it has been a rewarding lesson learned!

Second Grade News:

Second graders are in the holiday spirit! We made cards to spread our holiday cheer with those living in an assisted living facility. We have also learned about various holidays that different cultures and religions celebrate. Some examples include Diwali, Three Kings Day, and Hanukkah. We continued our holiday and winter-themed fun this week by reading some books by one of our favorite authors, Jan Brett! Here are some of our favorites!



Third Grade News:

To get into the holiday spirit the third-grade students have been reading and listening to holiday stories. One story shared was <u>The Little Red Sleigh</u> written by Erin Guendelsberger. The book reminds us that no dream is out of reach if you believe. Students wrote a descriptive paragraph about a holiday gift that could be received. The gift was not named in the paragraph because students guessed what the gift was when the writing was read aloud. Students had fun listening to the details in the writing and making their guesses. Next week we will be reading a favorite story, <u>How the Grinch Stole</u> <u>Christmas!</u> by Theodor "Dr. Seuss" Geisel. Students will identify positive and negative traits that portray the Grinch! Remember to take part next week in our Student Council's Holiday Spirit Week!

Fifth Grade News:

In Math, the fifth graders are continuing to develop their understanding of division by using number sense and models to divide whole numbers up to 4-digit by 2-digit divisors. They will also use strategies such as rounding and compatible numbers to estimate quotients. Students will then use a standard algorithm to calculate the actual quotients. Here's a fun way to remember the steps: Does In Science, the students are learning about the four earth's spheres which are the biosphere, atmosphere, hydrosphere, and geosphere. They have used a variety of resources to examine these spheres and are developing a three-dimensional model showing how two spheres interact and affect our world.

Music News:

Congratulations to everyone who performed in this year's Winter Concert. You all did such a wonderful job. The second-grade concert was filled with Santa Claus classics. Great job remembering all 12 days of Christmas! The fourth graders did a wonderful job singing well-known songs and "Hot Chocolate" from one of my personal favorite holiday movies, "The Polar Express". I was very impressed with how the evening concert performances went. The sixth graders sang beautifully in both English and German and gave everyone a laugh with their silly version of "O' Christmas Tree". The Advanced Band played with such a strong sound and great confidence! And this year's Select Choir sang two songs with melody and harmony together. Each group did a fantastic job. Sixth Grade News:

Math

After spending quite some time polishing up skills needed to work fluently with decimals and fractions, we have now added working with all rational numbers to our mathematics repertoire. Students have been working to extend their knowledge of positive numbers to now include understanding what it means to have a negative number. Students explored plotting numbers on a four-quadrant coordinate plane and used absolute value to find the distance between two points on that plane. This included the understanding that distance is always positive and that absolute value is the mathematical representation of a number's distance from zero. We have most recently begun to break down whole numbers into their prime factorization using factor trees. Knowing a number's prime factorization can help to determine the greatest common factor (GCF) that two numbers have in common. Knowing the GCF will help sixth graders solve more difficult math problems that require representing expressions in multiple ways. Solving for unknown quantities will be our next area of study in sixth grade and will include understanding what an equation represents and how to use the foundational skills we have learned so far to solve algebraic equations with one variable. Becoming good problem solvers continues to be embedded in all the math we do. After all, that is our purpose for learning math, to be able to solve problems!

<u>Science</u>

After a unit learning about reproduction in plants and animals, students used the engineering process to solve the real-world problem of decreasing pollinator populations and the potential for impact on human diet and nutrition. Pollinators help provide people and other animals with nuts, fruits, and a variety of vegetables. Students were posed with the task to design a flower that would attract an animal pollinator and help strengthen our food supply. They researched a pollinator (of their choice) and designed a flower that would attract that pollinator. Students presented and explained why their

design would help solve the problem. Their solutions were creative and they had a great time with this hands-on activity.




Community Information:
