PRESCHOOL NEWS:

The Preschool students just finished up their Beginning of the Year study. They worked hard to learn our preschool classroom routines, rules, names of important people in our school, and how to make friends. We participated in Fire Prevention Day with the help of the Stillwater Fire Department! We also participated in our very first Spirit Week of the school year to show our kindness. Next week we will begin our Trees study! We'll be observing and comparing trees to learn about types and parts of trees, what lives in them, what grows on them, how trees change, and who cares for them. We hope that this study will help children explore and appreciate nature. As we study trees, we will use literacy, math, the arts, and technology to explore the topic in depth. We will learn important social studies and scientific concepts through first-hand investigations. If you are able to take a "tree walk" with your child, we would appreciate your help in collecting tree parts to investigate. If you can, please take a bag to a treed area and collect things that have fallen, such as leaves, bark, acorns, twigs, flowers, fruit, or cones. Happy Fall!!



LLD CLASS NEWS:

We have been busy working on Life Skills by practicing shoe typing and how to dial our phone number. Students have been hard at work writing sentences using proper sentence structure and reviewing math skills (touchpoints, skip counting, and single-digit addition). Be sure to look out for important messages on the sign out front of the school. Students update it frequently so you don't miss out on events!

THIRD GRADE NEWS:

In reading, we finished our first text: <u>Tigers at Twilight</u> by Mary Pope Osborne. We reviewed story elements and practiced looking back in the text to find the answers to questions. This

week we launched Readers Workshop! Students learned how to choose "Just Right" books, how to build reading stamina, and how to have a meaningful book discussion with partners. We will soon start our mentor text: <u>Stone Fox</u>. In writing, students can successfully write paragraphs that have a topic sentence, detailed sentences, and a closing sentence. Now we are diving into writing our personal narratives, where we will work through the writing process. In social studies, we have been learning about communities and Sussex County. Did you know that there are 21 counties in NJ? The third grade will be going on their field trip to Tranquility Farms on Friday, October 22nd (rain date: 10/25).

FIFTH GRADE NEWS:

The fifth graders have started this school year working very hard. They are reading a Historical Fiction book called <u>Honus and Me</u> and practicing their visualizing and summarizing strategies to support comprehension. The students are also busy working on improving their personal narratives by adding dialogue to their writing as well as sensory descriptive words. In Math class, the students have been busy with place values of both whole numbers and decimals. They have learned what an exponent is and how to write expanded form using exponents. In Science, the fifth graders have examined food chains and food webs extensively. They enjoyed a Math/Science lesson outdoors when they measured the length and width of a Megalodon and drew this massive creature with chalk on the front blacktop area of the school. The students enjoyed measuring this length with their bodies as well! In Social Studies, the students are busy learning about explorers and have created detailed posters about the significance of these explorers!





SIXTH GRADE MATH NEWS:

Students in 6th-grade math have been exploring real-world problems that can be solved using decimals and fractions. The 4 basic operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division have been expanded upon to include all rational numbers. Students have been practicing these mathematical operations with the set of positive rational numbers in order to become more fluent when working with numbers that include parts of a whole. An emphasis on applying the eight mathematical practice standards and multiple ways to solve the same problem has been an important part of helping students develop and practice their problem-solving skills. Coming up, students will learn about integers, absolute values and the 4 quadrants of the coordinate plane.


