

FIFTH GRADE NEWS

The fifth graders have been working extremely hard on understanding integers, which is a sixth grade math skill. During the year, we focused solely on positive numbers, but now the students understand the concept of integers. They learned how to read and write negative numbers and use negative numbers to represent quantities in real-world concepts. They also learned what absolute value means and how to compare and order integers. With these new skills, the students were able to graph 4 quadrant pictures which include both positive and negative numbers.

All fifth graders will be given a folder which will contain both the Language Arts and Math summer packets. It's important for the students to work on these packets throughout the summer and return their completed packets on the first day of school in September.

SIXTH GRADE NEWS

Sixth-grade math students completed the final math unit in their textbooks on "Data Analysis and Statistics". They learned how to identify statistical questions and to represent data with a histogram. They then learned about measures of center (mean, median, and mode) and variability (range). Students determined if there weree outliers or if the data is symmetrical to help them decide which measures were best to represent different data sets. We are finishing out the year by learning to be financially literate. We learned and practiced these skills by following a hypothetical scenario of a recent college graduate who chooses a new job by analyzing cost of living indexes, moving expenses, payroll deductions, calculating tax and apartment hunting costs. We discussed different types of wages, bank accounts, ATM, debit and credit cards, simple/compound interest and many other financial concepts. It has been eye-opening for students to see all that needs to be considered to make financially sound decisions and to see what adults need to consider as they earn money and pay their bills!


