




THIRD GRADE NEWS

On Wednesday, third graders went on their field trip to the Franklin Mineral Museum located in Franklin, N.J. While visiting, they got to visit Baum Hall where they got to see lots of minerals. They got to see local fluorescent minerals in a dark room that were brightly glowing in rich hues of red, green, orange, yellow, and blue. Students saw a large collection of American Indian artifacts and fossils. They also visited a life-size mine replica that showed examples of mining methods used in the Franklin mines. The students got to go into Buckwheat Dump to collect their own minerals. They went into a darkroom facility with ultraviolet lamps that allowed the students to examine their fluorescent specimens before deciding which to keep. Third Graders had a wonderful trip!


