




FIRST GRADE NEWS:

The first graders just finished their Writer's Workshop unit on informational stories. In this unit they learned that teaching stories not only include alot of information on a topic in the words, but also in the pictures through labels, captions and zoom- ins. The students celebrated the end of their unit by sharing their published stories with classmates. They taught each other about many different topics from dogs to how to play soccer. We are so proud of how they are growing as writers.

NEWS FROM SECOND GRADE

Second graders have completed their science unit on matter! We have done several experiments to learn about solids, liquids, and gases, and their properties. Students participated in a balloon-poke experiment to determine whether a solid, liquid, or gas was inside each balloon. Students also worked with their peers on another experiment involving soda, pop rocks, and a balloon! The next time you see a second grader, ask them what happened to the balloon once the pop rocks went into the soda! This is how we learned about a gas being present! We have also learned how matter can change, with some changes being reversible such as folding paper, and some irreversible, such as baking a blueberry muffin! Students saw muffin mix in its solid form, then mixed into a liquid batter, then discussed how that liquid batter becomes a solid muffin once heated! Lastly, we have learned that properties of matter are important to understand when choosing an object to use for an intended purpose. We have discussed this as it relates to plastic, glass, and steel lunch containers. We have also tested the properties of matter while trying to make a tower out of index cards and test its strength to hold up a book! Our final experiment of this unit is to test the properties of "mud" to see if it is possible to make a house with it! We've been having a lot of fun learning and experimenting!











NEWS FROM MRS. SMETANA

January 23-27 is designated in schools across the country as **The Great Kindness Challenge**. This week Stillwater students and staff participated in a school spirit week to promote kindness and to complete the daily kindness challenge. Everyone has been encouraged to perform as many kind acts at school and home!

Summit Student Leaders have continued to work on implementing our school wide action plan to promote a positive school climate. Beginning next Monday grades 3-6 will participate in **MIX-IT-UP Mondays**. The purpose of MIX-IT-UP Mondays is for students to be more social, make new friends, foster a sense of community, and promote inclusion. Students will be randomly assigned to lunch tables. Summit student leaders have created conversation starters to be used at the lunch tables to get everyone talking and to learn about one another.

Our efforts to build social and emotional competencies in our youth can not happen without the support of our families and community partners. In honor of *The Great Kindness Challenge*, below are **Tips for Raising Kind Kids** and a **Family Checklist** attachment.

- 1. Use the language of kindness. "Would you be kind enough to help your sister with ____?" "Could you use kinder words to say that?" "Thank you for your kindness."
- 2. As a family, practice kindness. Discuss ways to put kindness into action. Discuss ways you can show kindness in your family, school, neighborhood, and so on.
- 3. Model kindness in word and deed. Treat children with kindness. Set an example of kindness and respect by how you treat and talk about other people outside the family. Set an example within your family by the way grown-ups talk to one another. Set the tone for uncharitable talk about other people and explain why such talk is not kind or respectful.
- 4. Insist on kindness and respect in all family interactions. Correct unkind and disrespectful

behavior. "Can you kindly say that in a more respectful way?" Don't allow siblings to be unkind, disrespectful, or rude to one another. Don't allow children to be disrespectful to you, either in what they say or how they say it.

1. Teach kindness by giving responsibilities in family life - teach the spirit of helpfulness. Research demonstrates that children who are expected to be contributing family members develop a greater concern for others.




