September 25, 2023

## **EDUCATION & CURRICULUM**

- 1. SSDS Reporting Period 2: January 1, 2023- June 30, 2023- Dr. Kochis reported on the following: SSDS Reporting Period 2-There were 9 incidents total- 1 confirmed HIB, 4 alleged HIB, and 5 other incidents leading to removal. Various programs were held during this time period such as the Counseling Lessons by Mrs. Smetana, Mix it up lunches, Den Rally, Student Council service project, and buddy days.
- 2. 2022-2023 HIB Grades Self-Assessment- Dr. Kochis completed the assessment. We scored 75 out of 78 points.
- 3. Motion made by Mrs. Kraft, second by Mrs. Williver, to approve Renaissance Learning to provide training to staff on benchmark analysis on 10/23/23, 1/22/24, and 3/25/24 for \$900.00. Paid for through Title IV funds. A voice vote was taken and unanimously approved.
- 4. Motion made by Mrs. Kraft, second by Mrs. Valeich, to approve the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History to give professional development on Teaching Literacy through History.    Resolution declaring October 2-6, 2023 Week of Respect
  - WHEREAS, The Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights, Assembly Bill 3466, was approved by the New Jersey Legislature in November 2010 and signed into law as P.L. 2010, c. 122, by Governor Chris Christie on January 5, 2011; and
  - WHEREAS, The statute is intended to protect students from harassment and intimidation that would substantially interfere with their education; and
  - WHEREAS, In a 2009 survey by the National Centers for Disease Control, one in five New Jersey students indicated they had been the subject of bullying on school grounds during the previous year; and
  - WHEREAS, The Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights places expanded responsibilities on teachers, school administrators and boards of education to protect students from incidents of bullying, harassment and intimidation; and
  - WHEREAS, The Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights designates the week beginning with the first Monday in October as "Week of Respect" throughout New Jersey"; and
  - WHEREAS, The law directs school districts to observe the "Week of Respect" through age-appropriate instruction in accordance with New Jersey's core curriculum content standards; and
  - WHEREAS, The Stillwater Board of Education recognizes the harmful impact of harassment and bullying on children and is committed to providing all of its students with a safe and secure learning environment free from intimidation; and
  - WHEREAS, The Stillwater Board of Education supports the intent of the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights to protect our children, as well as the goal of previous law to enhance training and instruction to prevent harassment, intimidation and bullying. Now therefore be it
  - RESOLVED, That the Stillwater Board of Education declares October 2 through 6, 2022 as a "Week of Respect" in all district schools, and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Week of Respect will be a part of the Stillwater Public Schools' ongoing efforts to foster respect among students and staff for the diverse cultures and personalities represented in our school community, and be it further

RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be sent to Governor Phil Murphy, State Senator Oroho, Assembly Representatives Space and Wirths, the New Jersey School Boards Association and the Sussex County School Boards Association. A roll call vote was taken and unanimously approved.

8. Motion made by Mrs. Kraft, second by Mrs. Frey, to declare October 16-20, 2023 School Violence Awareness Week:

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 18A:36-5.1. declares the week beginning with the third Monday in October of each year is designated as "School Violence Awareness Week" in the State of New Jersey. School districts shall observe this week by organizing activities to prevent school violence including, but not limited to, age-appropriate opportunities for student discussion on conflict resolution, issues of student diversity, and tolerance. Law enforcement personnel shall be invited to join members of the teaching staff in the discussions. Programs shall also be provided for school board employees that are designed to help them recognize warning signs of school violence and to instruct them on recommended conduct during an incident of school violence. The Department of Education shall provide guidelines and information to boards of education for use in planning the activities in observance of the week and such funds as are necessary to pay the costs of the required activities and programs.

RESOLVED, That the School Violence Awareness Week will be a part of the Stillwater Township Schools' ongoing efforts to help students and staff to recognize the importance of tolerance and to understand and apply conflict resolution techniques.

WHEREAS, the Stillwater Township School District lost \$293,701 in New Jersey State Aid for fiscal year 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Stillwater Township School District lost \$315,416 in New Jersey State Aid for fiscal year 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Stillwater Township School District lost \$273,829 in New Jersey State Aid for fiscal year 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Stillwater Township School District lost \$177,779 in New Jersey State Aid for fiscal year 2020; and

WHEREAS, The Stillwater Township School District has lost a total of \$1,207,919 in New Jersey State Aid over the past five school years; and

WHEREAS, The Stillwater Township School District anticipates additional New Jersey State funding cuts through fiscal year 2025; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Stillwater Township School District is requesting \$1,990,000 in Stabilization Aid from the State of New Jersey for the 2023-2024 school year in order to offset the significant losses in revenue over the past several years; and

THEREFORE, BE IT ALSO RESOLVED these losses continue to have a significant impact on the school district, our students, our staff, and our community. This Stabilization Aid is necessary for the continued operation of our school district as we navigate our way through a challenging fiscal environment while ensuring the safe and appropriate education of the children in our community. The Stabilization Aid would be utilized for construction projects to maintain a safe and secure space for our students and staff.
