## **Food Delivery Policy**

Due to safety concerns, and strangers, who deliver food claiming to be a mom or a dad, **no outside food from any food delivery service (such as Uber Eats, DoorDash, etc.) will be accepted.** If a parent wants to drop off food, the parent can deliver the food to the office. If any food delivery is attempted, the delivery driver will be turned away and Duncan Polytechnical High School will not be responsible for any refunds. If a student attempts to order food and is delivered, the food will be confiscated.

## **Release of Students**

**Students will only be released to an adult 18 years of age or older that is listed on the emergency card and must show a valid California ID to verify their identity.**

**We encourage all appointments to be scheduled after school hours to ensure your student is present and does not miss instruction.**

*If your student has an appointment during school hours, please report to the main office. Once you (parent or guardian) enter the office, and sign student out, staff will call the classroom to release the student.*

**Duncan will not allow students to use ride sharing services such as, but not limited to, Taxis, Uber, and LYFT.**

## **Cell Phone Policy**

Per District Board Policy (BP 5139) and Administrative Regulation (AR 5139), Duncan students may possess a cell phone on campus. **However, with the passing of California Assembly Bill (AB272) which adds section 48901.7 to the Education Code stating that schools may adopt a policy to limit or prohibit the use of smartphones and/or smartwatches by students while at school.** The teacher may temporarily take possession of a student's phone if it is out and/or used during class time. Depending on the number of occasions and past discussions, the phone will be released to the student at the end of the period or will require a parent to pick up the phone from the main office. The protocol can be found in the Duncan's Poly's student handbook.

However, (before school, during lunchtime and after school) students will be allowed to use their cell phones. Duncan Polytechnical High School is not held responsible for any damage or stolen cell phones.
