

He is Pastor-Teacher of Warren Baptist Church in Augusta, Georgia (Oct. 2008–present). He served as Teaching Pastor of Prestonwood Baptist Church in Plano, Texas (2002–2008), Senior Pastor of Boca Raton Community Church in Boca Raton, Florida (1998–2002), Senior Pastor of First Baptist Church Merritt Island, Florida (1992–1998), Associate Pastor of Prestonwood Baptist Church in Dallas, Texas (1989–1992) and Associate Pastor of First Baptist Church West Palm Beach, Florida (1983–1989).

Dr. McKinley earned a Master of Divinity degree from Mid-America Baptist Theological Seminary and a Doctor of Ministry degree from Talbot School of Theology. He has traveled with ministry groups to China, Cuba, Ecuador, Greece, Israel, Italy, North Korea, Panama, Peru, Romania and South Africa.

He and his wife, Connie, have two adult children and eight grandchildren.
