## District-wide Student Health and Facility Improvements

- Expand and improve kitchens at Windsor and Salnave Elementary Schools
- Resurface track at Cheney High School
- HVAC upgrades at Windsor, Salnave, Betz, Sunset Elementary Schools, and Cheney High School
- District-wide plumbing upgrades to extend the life of our equipment
- Interior updates to provide a welcoming environment to every student at Betz, Sunset, and Windsor Elementary Schools and Cheney High School
- LED lighting upgrades to improve learning environment and reduce operational costs

## Capacity

The Cheney School District is growing. Our elementary schools are currently over capacity and serving more students than they were designed to house. It is projected that by the 2027-2028 school year there will be 200 more students in our already-crowded elementaries. Secondary school enrollment is projected to exceed the capacity of our current facilities by the 2027-2028 school year.

**ADDITIONAL ELEMENTARY STUDENTS BY 2027-2028**

A land purchase now is the first step in our strategic plan to address current and future district growth. This land purchase will enable us to begin planning solutions for future growth, specifically at the secondary grade levels.

Funds from this bond measure would construct a new elementary school in Airway Heights. This would reduce overcrowding and reliance on portable buildings throughout our elementary schools. **Building a new school where our students live will increase walkability and reduce the need to transport students to schools outside of their area.**



Our kitchens were not built to prepare and serve food to the increased demand of serving over 5,000 daily school-provided meals. This bond will provide the additional kitchen space and updated equipment needed to serve healthy and nutritious food to accommodate the increased demand of school provided meals.

## District-wide student health and facility improvements

Upgrading heating, ventilation and air conditioning equipment **improves learning environments for our students and staff**, reduces operational costs and extends the life of our buildings.



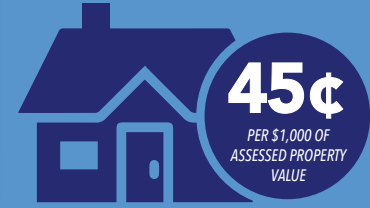
Student health, wellbeing, and academic success are directly linked to the condition and comfort of their school facility. **Interior updates provide the welcoming environment that every student needs to succeed.**

Building system upgrades such as boilers, chillers, HVAC units, and electrical equipment **improve the quality of the learning environment for students** and promote responsible management of our facilities.



## Safe Learning Environments

This bond will provide significant traffic revisions for safer bus loops and parent pick up areas, while reducing traffic congestion around school buildings during peak times. **The bond will also provide upgraded safety and security equipment and procedures to school access points that will safeguard students, staff and our community.**



The cost of this bond is estimated to add **\$0.45** per \$1,000 of assessed property value, **which will generate \$72 million to improve student learning environments.**

Projects in this bond have been prioritized as part of the Long Range Facilities Plan. This bond will provide funding to make necessary improvements throughout the district that will address district growth, correct building capacity, and increase student safety. Local, voter approved funding stays in Cheney Public Schools to support all of our students.
