## **School Policies**

#### **Dress Code:**

As we move into 2nd semester, we would like to take a moment to remind families about our school's dress code policies. Our school dress code was designed to promote self expression while also ensuring professionalism as we focus on a positive learning environment for all students. As partners in your child's education, please take a moment to discuss these reminders with your student.



Here are some key points to keep in mind regarding our school dress code: Our full dress code policy can be found here.

**Pajamas:** Over the holidays, many students receive a wide variety of sleepwear including PJ tops, bottoms, and slippers. In many cases, these are the colorful, flannel PJ's. Please remind student not to wear these items to school. No slippers, blankets, or pillows.

**Appropriate graphics/language**: Please ensure that your child's clothing is appropriate for a learning environment. Avoid clothing with offensive language or graphics including weapons.

**Hats:** Hats are not to be worn inside the school building. Examples include, but are not limited to baseball caps, bandanas, beanies, cowboys hats, hoodies pulled over head and any other head covering.

FBMS values and supports our diverse student perspectives as a form of self-expression, and we strive to balance individuality with the shared responsibility of maintaining a professional and positive school environment. Your support in reinforcing these guidelines with your child is greatly appreciated.

#### Student ID's at lunches:

As you may recall from our beginning of the year communication, this year all students in Jeffco are required to bring their ID to lunch in order to enjoy district breakfast/lunch items. Unfortunately, we have many students who regularly forget their student ID. This slows down the process considerably as it takes additional time for cafeteria staff to look up and type in ID numbers in our system. To expedite the lunch line, beginning in January, students without ID's will be called to the line after all other students have picked up their items. If your student has lost their ID, please have them complete this request form. This form is also located in their Advise google classroom.

#### **Transportation:**

Due to driver shortages and combined bus routes for Falcon Bluffs, any student needing to ride a different bus other than their assigned bus MUST get this approved by transportation first. The buses to and from our school are at capacity. Please call transportation at 303-982-9057 to get this approved prior to your student riding a friend's bus. Once approved, please send a note with your student giving permission to ride the non-assigned bus. Your student will need to bring the note to the office and have it signed by office staff. Once signed by someone in the office, your student will give the note to the bus driver.



## From the Counseling Office

Dear Falcon Families,

Over the next several weeks, your child will be discussing bullying as part of Second Step® Middle School. Bullying is at its peak in middle school, and research indicates that taking proactive steps to address bullying will help reduce occurrences of it in our school. Second Step Middle School is designed to support your child in developing the knowledge and skills to help stop bullying. Students will learn how to recognize bullying in various contexts, how to use strategies to stand up safely to bullying, and how to seek help if they or someone they know is being bullied.

Here are some key definitions your child will be learning:

#### 6th Grade

- Bullying: intentional physical, verbal, or social aggression. It's often repeated over time and occurs when there's a real or perceived power imbalance.
- Bystander: anyone who's aware that bullying is happening
- Online bullying: the use of technology to harass, threaten, or intimidate another person
- Physical bullying: hurting someone's body or possessions
- Relational bullying: hurting someone's reputation or relationships, such as by excluding them
- Upstander: someone who stands up for a person being bullied
- Verbal bullying: saying or writing mean things about someone

#### 7th Grade

- Bullying: intentional physical, verbal, or social aggression. It's often repeated over time and occurs when there's a real or perceived power imbalance.
- Gender-based harassment: aggression against someone based on their sex. This also includes aggression against someone because they do not conform to male or female stereotypes.
- Harassment: aggression against someone based on a real or perceived characteristic they have, such as their race, religion, sex, or gender. It's serious enough to create an unsafe environment and is a form of discrimination.
- Sexual harassment: when someone bothers someone else with words, actions, or pictures of a sexual nature.

#### 8th Grade:

- Bullying: intentional physical, verbal, or social aggression. It's often repeated over time and occurs when there's a real or perceived power imbalance.
- Environmental factors: the physical space and any rules and regulations that apply within an area
- Harassment: aggression against someone based on a real or perceived characteristic they have, such as their race, religion, sex, or gender. It's serious enough to create an unsafe environment and is a form of discrimination.
- Social factors: common beliefs, attitudes, and behaviors of a particular group or community

We encourage students to report any instances of bullying they witness or experience to you and to trusted adults at our school. Additionally, if you have any questions about Second Step Middle School, please don't hesitate to contact our Administrative Team and/or Counseling Team for more information. Thank you for your support as we work together to build a bullying -free community.

Summary: Jeffco issued TechforEd Devices go home over the summer with students.

As Jeffco continues to prepare students to thrive in a connected, digital world, all students in grades 1-12 have been provided with a personalized learning device. These devices will be sent home over the summer\* with all students. By having the devices over the summer, it will allow students to continue learning and to create equity among all of our students. Families are encouraged to manage the usage/access to the device as they feel is appropriate.

\*12th graders will turn in their device in May, to be communicated from their school.

\*Students in Kindergarten will not take a device home over the summer. However, if a kindergarten student is enrolled in Jeffco Reads, their school will issue a device to the student.

## Moving OR changing schools over the summer?

Families moving outside of Jeffco or to a charter school need to return their devices to their school; if their school is no longer open the device should be returned to Jeffco Public Schools, 1829 Denver West Dr., Bldg. 27, Golden, CO 80401.

Families moving within Jeffco can take their device with them to their new school. 5th grade students will take their device to middle school with them for use through 8th grade. 8th grade students will take their device to high school with them, where they will trade it in for a new device to be used throughout high school.

## **Drop-Off and Pick-Up Procedures**

Hello Falcon Bluffs Families,

My name is Kameron Strunk, and I am the new SRO (School Resource Officer) for Falcon Bluffs. I graduated from Falcon in 2007 and have spent most of my life living in Jefferson County. It is an honor to be a part of the Falcon Bluffs family and I look forward to meeting you in the months ahead. I am proactively reaching out to parents for support on a few items. I have observed numerous unsafe driving incidents over the past few weeks during student drop-off and pick-up. These incidents include illegal U-turns, speeding, and trespassing. Some vehicles are making U-turns in front of moving traffic on the north side of the school, and in some cases, have even run over caution signs while doing so. We have had several "close calls" where drivers have almost hit our crossing guards due to lack of attention and/or speeding. Lastly, many drivers have ignored the private property signs of the small private community located to the north of the school and chosen to drive through despite the action resulting in trespassing.



It is my number one goal as the SRO for Falcon Bluffs to ensure your children are safe from all threats while attending school and it is a responsibility I take very seriously. As a parent myself I know it is easy to feel rushed during our pick-up/ drop-off times, yet we all need to plan a few extra minutes for this process in support of student/staff safety. I am asking for your help, your patience, and your understanding during these times. Please be extra vigilant and build more time into your routine.

In an attempt to make drop-off and pick-up a safer environment for all the children crossing the busy streets, I will be monitoring traffic during those times, noting violations/unsafe driving. Starting next week, I will conduct traffic stops with the hope that a verbal warning is enough to affect a positive change in driving behavior. After next week I will take a zero-tolerance stance, resulting in citations. If I observe or learn of inappropriate behavior toward our crossing guards, I will issue a summons for careless/reckless driving which carries a mandatory court appearance and a misdemeanor penalty if convicted.

Again, it is my desire to affect a positive change in the driving habits around the school in a manner that does not involve traffic citations, however, we need to work together to create immediate and lasting change in support of our children's safety.
