At Page High School we are **committed to creating a learning environment that is safe and welcoming**. In order to help keep our students and staff healthy this cold and flu season, we have emptied our cleaning supplies and are ordering more as they become available. We also want to ensure our students are coming to school ready to learn. This means when our students are sick, they take proper care of themselves. Sometimes this means they stay home from school to recover more quickly.

We ask that **students with a fever or any type of respiratory illness, stay home**. We want our students to be healthy and recover quickly. Students should feel well enough to go about their normal student behaviors throughout the day, such as staying awake during class, keeping their heads up/sitting up, eating lunch, walking from class-to-class, etc.

Likewise, we are asking **staff to stay home if they have a fever or are sick enough that they cannot perform their professional responsibilities**. As always, we encourage everyone at PHS to wash or sanitize hands often, especially when they blow their noses, use the restroom, etc. **Coughing/sneezing etiquette calls us to cough in our elbow or behind a barrier like our shirt or a tissue**.

Many health care providers are recommending that **handshaking be suspended through this cold and flu season** in order to keep your germs to yourself. There are lots of other options for a courteous greeting: I really like a gentle smile with "hello." Contact is nil, but impact is kind.

Hello and welcome to my latest collection of things I think are important to tell you. To begin with, Parent/Teacher Conferences are coming up. We are switching up the format for this round of

conferences. You should have received a letter about this, but if not, this is generally what is going to happen:



- **Parents & students meet with Advisory teacher at a scheduled time**
- **Meeting held in Advisory teacher's classroom**
- **Will be scheduled by students during Advisory**
- **Conferences scheduled 10 minutes apart, for 8 minute conferences with 2 minute transition time**
- **Conference will be student led, presenting portfolio of grades, transcripts, career goals, and test scores**
- **The opportunity to also meet with individual teachers will be available**

We also will begin **state testing** in March. This year, all 10th graders will be tested in Science, Reading, Writing and Math. **Science will be March 24th & 25th during Biology class.** The rest of our tests will be administered beginning first thing in the morning, **the week of March 30th.** Specific schedules for which days individuals are to test will be distributed to the students, through their English teachers. It is always important to be at school on time. On testing days, the importance is magnified. Please be sure your students are here, on time, and ready to show how well they can perform.






Dear Parents/Guardians,






