CHO is a local interfaith nonprofit



THIS AGING THING

I live in a place where I'm surrounded by old people. Of course, I'm one of them, but more often than not, I feel like a young person in an old person's body. Certainly, keeping up with all the doctors' appointments grounds me in reality. Our attitude about this aging thing is key. I recall my mother who, at 95, was being chastised by her doctor for abruptly stopping a medication he'd prescribed. I can still see her, sitting on the examining table in her blue paper gown, swinging her crossed ankles. "Why did you do that, Ann?" he asked, and her reply was "Because I'm 95 and I can do what I want!"

In my active retirement community, conversations with my fellow residents over dinner occasionally turn into "organ recitals," descripttions of various illnesses that have befallen us. Although we've bonded as friends after a relatively short period of time, the demise of one of us is keenly felt by all. I think this reminds us of our own mortality, something I believe we're not all that comfortable thinking about. We mourn these losses and comfort each other, but in our heart of hearts, even as we contemplate death and acknowledge its inevitability, we think, "Sure. One day, but not yet."

A regular practice here is an annual wellness check with our primary care physician. The first question on the form we fill out is "What is your goal for the coming year?" Some say they're planning a trip abroad; others that they want to live to see a great grandchild, some wish to celebrate another birthday, to be more active, to lose weight, to be happy. My response has always been the same: "I want to live my best life." This allows me a lot of leeway, since my best life is a moving target. Sometimes it's great, sometimes it's okay, sometimes not so much.

As we move into our old age, we become more aware of the quality of our living, mostly because the years have taken their toll on our bodies, and aches and pains are daily reminders that can steal our joy. Often, we're surprised, not knowing what the next day will bring. We go to bed feeling fine and wake up in the morning only to find something swollen, stiff, dried up, or leaking. It makes me laugh, really, at the depth of the folly of continuing to think we're in charge. Experience tells us that old age is not for sissies. It takes a deep well of faith, courage, patience, and acceptance to keep on going, as well as a strong sense of humor.



Not all the aspects of aging are negative. However, sometimes it takes work to bring us to the place where we can find satisfaction in the way we've lived, despite the warts, and remember those who've helped us along the way. As we reflect, we can see God's hand in placing us in the right place at the right time, how somehow good was eventually found in something painful that may have happened to us. And today, those of us who are "up there" in years can feel God at work when we've fallen down, gotten back up, and kept on trying, over and over again. It's in the trying, with His grace, that we're able to prevail.

REFLEXION SALESIANA

Vigesimosegundo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario 1 de septiembre

Las lecturas de hoy nos exhortan a vivir los mandamientos, la Palabra de Dios, de una manera que nos permita adquirir sabiduría, y que nos permita demonstrar ante Él que nuestro corazón es puro. San Francisco de Sales nos habla sobre los mandamientos de Dios, a la luz de vivir y amar Su voluntad:

Hay ciertos asuntos, como en lo que respecta los mandamientos o a las obligaciones propias de nuestra vocación, en que estamos plenamente conscientes de cuál es la voluntad de Dios. Amar significa vivir de acuerdo a Su voluntad. Quienes se consideran justos no lo son verdaderamente a menos que posean el amor sagrado, del cual depende la formación de un corazón realmente puro.

El verdadero amor siempre busca complacer a todos aquellos en quienes se deleita. La palabra de Dios nos resulta sumamente agradable ya que es decretada por el amor. Cuando disfrutamos con frecuencia los mandamientos de Dios, poco a poco nos vamos convirtiendo en quienes Él desea que seamos, al mismo tiempo que nuestra voluntad se transforma en la voluntad divina. Entre más nos deleitemos en el cumplimiento de la voluntad de Dios para con nosotros, más perfecta será nuestra transformación en el amor divino, que es la esencia verdadera de la sabiduría sublime.

¡Bienaventuradas aquellas almas que ya no se rigen por sus propios deseos, sino conforme a los designios de su Dios!

Para forjar en nosotros un amor saludable y santo por los mandamientos de Dios, debemos esmerarnos por descubrir su maravillosa belleza. Del mismo modo en el sol toca todas las cosas con su calor vivificante, y les proporciona el vigor necesario para que puedan ofrecer sus frutos, la bondad de dios toca y aviva todos los corazones para que puedan amar la palabra de Dios. Nuestro Padre nos ha facilitado medios más que suficientes para que nosotros podamos cumplir con los divinos mandamientos: nos ha proporcionado una abundante y generosa variedad de métodos para que logremos cumplir con el deseo divino que ha sido implantado en nuestros corazones.



Los mandamientos son dignos de amor, ya que éstos fomentan la bondad en quienes carecen de ella, y engrandecen la bondad en quienes la poseen. La dificultad no existe en aquello que amamos, y de haberla, es una dificultad que cuyo valor podemos llegar a apreciar. Es por esto que al mismo tiempo que la ley divina nos impone la obligación de obedecer la voluntad de Dios, también convierte ese compromiso en un amor santo, y todas las dificultades las transforma en júbilo.


