

- Students' MAX grade on reassessment is 75%

Attendance

• Email attendance note within 5 days of absence to:

HMSAttendance@fultonschools.org

- Include the following information:
 - Name of student
 - Student ID Number (lunch number)
 - Parent/Guardian Name, Email, & Phone Number
 - Reason for absence
 - Attach doctor's note if you have one

- Attendance calls and emails are automated
 - Don't stress because you get one
- Remote Workdays
 - Students are allowed 5 remote learning days per semester, to get approved for a remote learning day, email your grade level AP at least 5 days prior for approval

Phones

- FCS & HMS have a strict NO PERSONAL TECHNOLOGY policy.
- All personal devices should be kept in student lockers.
 - Phones
 - iPads
 - Headphones/Earbuds, etc.

- If a student needs to contact their parent, they may use the phone in the front office.
- Daily transportation home should be finalized in the mornings.
- If an administrator takes a student's phone, parents can be required to pick the phone up from the school.

DRESS CODE EXPECTATIONS

All parts of body in the outlined area must be covered.

Note: Fingertip length is NOT a metric.



- Intimate body parts must be covered.
- Undergarments must be covered.
- Hoods must stay off head.
- No head coverings except for religious head garments.
- Eyes should be visible.
- Costumes are not permitted, unless specified by the school.
- Shoes should be safe and appropriate for school.
- Messages, graphics, and pictures of/or promoting drugs, violence, weapons, sexual content, hate, or anything that admin deems inappropriate are not permitted.

Note: All language and graphics on clothing and personal items should be inclusive and kind.

Students are expected to follow all requirements in the Fulton County Code of Conduct.

Other Reminders

- No food deliveries (ordered by parent or student)
- Have backup money on the school lunch account
- Plan for the carpool to be busy, students to be in classrooms by 8:50
- The only bag students should carry during the school day is their device bag
- If a student forgets something you may drop it off at the front table, we are not responsible for missing items

Discipline Cycle



Learning Lunch

 During lunch, a staff member will help students reflect on their behavior, understand why they made certain choices in the past, and make better choices in the future.

After School Detention

•For an hour after school, a staff member will lead students in a discussion about the causes and effects of their choices and review the discipline cycle, as consequences for continued behavior will increase in severity.

Office Time-Out

- Discipline referral is coded into Infinite Campus.
 Student serves time-
- Student serves timeout during class period where incident occurred.
- Consequences for continued behavior will increase in severity.

In-School or Out-of-School Suspension

- Discipline referral is coded into Infinite Campus.
- Student serves assigned days of In-School or Out-of-School Suspension
- Consequences for continued behavior will increase in severity.



Title IX

Any complaint involving "sexual harassment" as defined by federal regulations that occurs in a District education program or activity against another person shall be addressed pursuant to the District Title IX Grievance Procedure (FCS Website, Departments, Title IX)


