## **GPA CALCULATION**

Grade point average (GPA) is based on a 4.0 scale, with the exception that honors courses receive 0.5 extra quality point and AP 500 level courses receive 1.0 extra quality point. All (CCS) upper school courses are included in the calculation of GPA. If a student enters Charlotte Christian with credits from another high school, a transcript from the previous high school will be enclosed with the CCS transcript. Those grades are not included in the CCS cumulative GPA calculation.

The academic year is comprised of two semesters. Transcripts are updated in June at the conclusion of each academic year.



# **ACADEMIC CONSERVATORY PROGRAM**

Charlotte Christian School recognizes that students are gifted in a variety of areas, including academics, athletics, fine arts, or spiritual life. The Academic Conservatory Program provides a special opportunity for students in academics, fine arts or ministry to challenge and stretch themselves beyond the four walls of the classroom. Conservatory achievement is noted on the student's transcript in the fall and spring of senior year upon completion of all requirements. From the Class of 2024, 14% of graduates received at least one conservatory distinction.

### **SEAL OF BILITERACY**

Beginning in 2019, CCS implemented the Seal of Biliteracy to recognize students for high achievement in multicultural education, based on a proficiency exam in the areas of listening, speaking, reading and writing in two languages. The prestigious endorsement is evidence of the student's ongoing commitment to long-term language learning and cultural awareness. From the Class of 2024, 4% of graduates earned this distinction.
