Important Reminders:

- We invite all parents to join our morning meetings that take place behind the MPR.
 - We ask that you please exit campus following the morning meeting. For security reasons, please sign in through the front office if you plan on staying on campus. We also ask that you make previous arrangements with the teacher if you plan on staying on campus to volunteer.
- If you pack a lunch from home... Due to the volume of traffic in the office as a result of student needs, we ask that you please send home lunches in the morning with students in their backpacks/lunch boxes.

Late Drop Offs:



All students will have to walk on their own to their classroom if they arrive late to class (parents are not to walk to classrooms after the school day has started as this will interrupt the flow of classroom procedures).

The only exception to this is TK students, they may be walked to their class by parents if they arrive late. Kinder to 6th grade students should walk to their classrooms on their own.

Thank you for your continued support in preventing thousands of articles of textile waste by utilizing the H.O.P.E. (Help Our Planet Earth) Uniforms Program or just by simply donating uniforms to help other families. The H.O.P.E. Uniforms Program has a very successful 2024 back-to-school season so far but we need your help to better serve the community. H.O.P.E. have helped over 220 families across the bay area, giving out and recycling over 1,500 articles of uniforms just these past few weeks. The H.O.P.E. Uniforms Program is a socially responsible and environmental organization that serves the local community by accepting and reusing

children's school uniforms, thereby reducing contribution to the landfills. H.O.P.E. Uniforms Program collects gently used school uniforms and donates them back to families in the community, free of charge. Then, when they outgrow those uniforms, they could donate them back and simply request the next size up from H.O.P.E, thereby creating an eco-friendly cycle. We have received tremendous demand this year, while we are able to recycle so many school uniforms, the influx of uniform requests has left our inventory depleted. In order to continue, we will need new donations in order to continue to help many more families to receive full and complete uniform orders to last them through the school year. If you have any student out sick, not feeling well, your student will be late, or will be having a doctor's or dentist appointment please make sure you call our <u>main office at 650-312-7737</u>. Please make sure you call <u>before</u> 10:00am on the day that your student will be absent and not the following day. If you don't notify us your student will be marked absent.

If your student is absent please make sure to bring a medical note as soon as the next day or when your student returns to school so that we may correct their attendance with enough time.
