This year, NHCS will again use a program called Neptune Navigate to teach students about digital citizenship. The lessons for this online program will be facilitated by the media specialist Ms. Mitchell during students' I.T. classes. They will begin these lessons later in the school year. We are seeing an increase in distracting behaviors as students play with watches during instruction.

- Grades 3-4 will participate in NC Check-In Formative Assessments for Reading on September 17, 2024.
- 5th Grade will participate in NC Check-In Formative Assessments for Reading and Science when we return from intercession. This date will be shared with families soon.
- NC Check Ins Information:
 - Subject/Type: Benchmark assessments for all EOGs and EOC courses
 - Required or Optional: Required based on school
 - Who takes it? All students in grades 3-5 -- Reading, Math, & Science
 - Administration Platform: Online
 - What is it and why is it important? NC Check-Ins are interim assessments aligned to North Carolina grade-level content standards. The end-of-grade (EOG) tests share a

common question bank with the NC Check-Ins, which then exposes NC Check-In students to similar question types and rigor found on the EOGs.

• How are the results used? Teachers use these results to reflect on students' learning progression of standards covered during instruction and to help support student learning.

Attention Volunteers:

Transportation / School Bus - Edulog

- Please click this <u>link</u> for a process for tracking your child's school bus in both the morning and the afternoon. You are able to set zone alerts to ensure students and parents meet the buses on time in both the morning and the afternoon.
- In the event a bus is late arriving in either the morning or the afternoon, Edulog will allow parents to see where the bus is in real time.

De Assignment Information

- In an effort to reduce late arrival & departures to & from school, students who do not meet ridership eligibility will be permanently de-assigned from NHCS's Transportation department. Exceptions are made on an individual basis. To remain eligible to ride a bus, students and parents/guardians/caregivers must:
 - ride the bus at least three (3) times per week
 - follow the procedures for 'meeting at the bus stop' for K-2 and special education students
 - follow safety procedures when riding the bus

Student and School Safety

Standards Based Protocols

New Hanover County Schools implemented a Standards Based Protocol in the 2023-2024 school year to ensure the safety of students, staff, and community members in the buildings. We will continue using these protocols to ensure our safety. Our staff and students practice the following safety protocols based on the Standards Based Protocols:

- 1. Hold / There is a potential medical emergency and we need the hallways clear
- 2. Secure / Protocol used to safeguard people in the building.
- 3. Lockdown / protocol used to secure individual rooms and keep students/staff quiet and in place
- 4. Evacuate / Things such as monthly fire drills are practiced to ensure students and staff know when and how to evacuate and where to evacuate
- 5. Shelter / Things such as tornado drills ensure students and staff know where to shelter during inclement weather.

Other important information for student & school safety.

- Everyone entering our building, excluding staff, are required to enter the office area after being allowed entrance to the building.
- All visitors must check in through the Ident-a-Kid computer program, print, and wear the identical sticker throughout their time in our building.
- All afternoon transportation changes must be communicated in **writing**, in the form of a paper note, with a parent signature. Changes cannot be made by email or phone.
 - In some cases, we can accept a transportation change via email, if a photograph of a valid government-issued ID along with a signature can be shared via email. We cannot guarantee that something sent via email will be read during the school day, and thus this form of communication for a transportation change is not optimal or recommended.
 - All of our transportation procedures are in place to keep children safe.

Volunteer Information / We love our volunteers!

All visitors to the building must complete <u>Level</u> I orientation and pass the assessment with 80% or better:

- 1. Read all of the information in this presentation, <u>Volunteer Orientation</u>, and the NHCS Volunteer Handbook (we will get this to you as soon as it becomes available).
- 2. Complete the <u>Volunteer Orientation Assessment</u> with a score of 80% or higher.

If wanting to attend a field trip or work with students in small groups outside of the classroom, you will then complete <u>Level II</u> requirements:

- Background Check Application.
- Cost: \$22.50
- Valid for three (3) years

If your background check expires on or before 9/15/24, you will be unable to volunteer as a Level II until Dr. McCarty receives Level II credentials including a new expiration date from NHCS district staff. She is monitoring this information on a weekly basis.

General Guidelines after receiving district clearance to serve as a volunteer:

- Please have your photo ID ready when coming to campus to either sign in.
- <u>When volunteering, please respect the instructional day including planning and</u> <u>preparation time of teachers and stay within your volunteer area.</u>
