### International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme

Our open enrollment policy allows any student to study for the full IB Diploma.



Since 1993 over 94% of our high school students have taken the full IB Diploma, and over 96% have successfully completed the programme.



All DP candidates in 2024 successfully passed the IB Diploma, with an average score of 36 points (compared to the world average of 30 points).



Close to one quarter (24%) of the DP candidates in 2024 received a bilingual Diploma.



One fifth (20%) of the cohort scored 40 points or more, placing them in the top 8% of IBDP candidates worldwide.

### COVID-19 IMPACT

The campus has been open and all lessons conducted in person since August 2020. Since May 2021, IB Diploma exams have been held on campus, and all candidates have been assessed on the exam route.

Twenty-five DP candidates successfully passed the full IB Diploma.

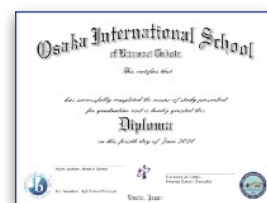

## OIS High School Diploma Programme

Students not taking the IB Diploma Programme will follow a course of study to complete the OIS High School Diploma, which is WASC-accredited and equivalent to a U.S. high school diploma.

This requires students to earn 24 credits over four years of high school (for more details please see the table on the left). Students will also complete a Personal Project in Grade 10, an extended essay or research paper in Grade 12, and satisfy the Creativity, Activity, and Service requirements in Grades 11 and 12.

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# EXTRA-CURRICULAR

## Athletics

Osaka International School belongs to two competitive activities leagues, one domestic and one international, each with season-ending championship tournaments. We are an active founding member of the domestic Western Japan Athletics Association, consisting of international schools and US military base schools from across Japan.

We are also a founding member of the international Association of International Schools in Asia organisation, where teams compete against schools from Japan, South Korea, China, and beyond. Both associations provide our athletes with weekly competitions and season-ending tournaments at high school varsity, junior varsity, and middle school level.

OIS athletes compete at varsity level in basketball, soccer, volleyball, baseball, softball, swimming, triathlon, and a number of other sports. More information can be found on our dedicated sports and activities website at <https://sabers.senri.ed.jp>



## Community and Service

In addition to a full and varied sports programme, a wide range of after-school clubs, and our popular Spring camps, OIS hosts a series of annual school events that bring the communities of our two schools together. Students take the lead in organising the School Festival in spring, Sports Day in fall, and the All School Production in winter. All these events offer excellent opportunities for students to learn cooperation, teamwork and leadership skills.

Beyond the school community, high school students participate in a number of national and international activities, including Model United Nations conferences, Global Issues Network: Global Ambassadors Program, service trips to help build and supply schools in Cambodia and Cebu, and homeless support networks in Osaka city.

## Shared Campus with Senri International School

OIS shares a campus, purpose, and mission with Senri International School of Kwansei Gakuin (SIS). Students enrolled in SIS study for the Japanese middle school and high school diplomas, following a curriculum approved by the Japanese Ministry of Education.

The shared 'SOIS' campus means that OIS and SIS students can spend plenty of time together. PE, art, music classes and selected language options are shared by students from both schools, whilst the concert bands, orchestras and choirs, the sports teams, and student government are also drawn from students from both schools. This creates a rich and stimulating learning environment for students from both schools.



## The Kwansei Gakuin Education Foundation

Kwansei Gakuin is one of the most prestigious private schools in Japan, dating back to 1889. It is now a comprehensive and integrated educational institution, incorporating Kwansei Gakuin University, Seiwa Junior College, Kwansei Gakuin Senior and Junior High Schools, Senri & Osaka International Schools of Kwansei Gakuin, Kwansei Gakuin Elementary School, and Kwansei Gakuin Kindergarten.

As one of Kansai's leading private universities, Kwansei Gakuin University offers bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees to around 25,000 students in over 80 different disciplines across 14 undergraduate schools and 14 graduate schools.
