EXPECTATIONS OF TIMBERWOLF BASKETBALL PARENTS

1. Support your daughter in her commitment to the Timberwolf Basketball Program.
2. Be proud of her effort and commitment.
3. Work with the basketball staff to make your daughter's experience positive and rewarding.
4. If you have any concerns or questions, contact the head coach. Do not approach a coach after a game with a concern about playing time. Emotions after a game are too high and it is not a good environment in which to discuss any situation.
5. If your daughter makes this commitment to the basketball program, then we will do our best to help her in every aspect of his life. Academics, behavior etc. It is not a one-way street.
6. Remember, the basketball staff is here to instill life lessons in your daughter. We will teach honor, discipline, hard work, enthusiasm, and many qualities that extend beyond the court.
7. Act with great sportsmanship at all times.

Expectations of Timberwolf Basketball Players

1. **Be a Good Citizen:** A player is a part of the program not just in the locker room and on the court. They are a part of the program all of the time and will be held to a standard of representing their teammates, coaches, school, parents, and community all of the time.
2. **Be Committed to the Program:** Commitment is shown through daily attendance and a positive attitude toward becoming successful as a team. Attendance will be taken daily, and all absences must be excused through communication with the Coach Walter or Coach Wurtz.
3. **Be a Good Student.** Eligibility will be based on the policies of Monticello Trails Middle School. Any student that requires extra academic time need only to make arrangements with Coach Walters or Coach Wurtz.
4. **Be a Good Teammate.** All players are equally important to the success of the team and will be valued as such by all players.
5. **Be respectful of facilities and those who take care of them.**
6. **Be responsible for your equipment.** If equipment is lost, it must be replaced, contact Coach Walters or Coach Wurtz about equipment issues.
7. **Take care of your body.** Report injuries immediately to Coach Walters or Coach Wurtz.
8. **Act with great sportsmanship at all times.**

Additional Information:

Practice Times:

PM Practice is 3:15- 4:45. Pre practice starts at 3:05. Arrival after 3:15 will be considered late. Please pick up as soon as possible or make arrangements for your daughter to ride with another parent.

AM Practice is 6-7:15. Pre practice starts at 5:45 with structured practice time starting at 6. Arrival after 6 am will be considered late.

Player Safety:

Concussions: Follow the KSHSAA policies and procedures. Athlete must have a written release from a MD or DO to return to practice and games.

Weather:

If school is closed due to weather, we will send out emails on whether we can practice or not. Use best judgement for AM practices.

Games:

All players will ride the bus to all away games unless prior arrangements have been made between parents and Coach Walter or Coach Wurtz. Parents will need to sign out players with a coach prior to taking them home. A bus will be provided to return home for all remaining players.

Outside School Teams:

Per KSHSAA rules:

While a member of the school team, a player may not play or practice with a non-school team. Playing or practicing would disqualify player from any further participation on our team.

Playing Time:

Playing time will be determined by coaches' evaluation of players and players meeting expectations. A Team and B Team will be fluid teams. We will communicate with the girls the practice before as to what they can expect at the next game.
