Check out Policy for Final Assessments:

On Monday, May 20th we will follow the same procedure for checking students out of school as normal with one exception. Students will be taking final assessments from 8:20 am until 11:35 am. Students must remain in their classroom until the block ends as we cannot interrupt the classes during Final Assessments. On Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, the first assessment for the day begins at 8:30 am and ends at 10:15 am. The break between the assessments is from 10:15–10:35 am. The second assessment for the day begins at 10:40 and ends at 12:25 pm. During the times of the assessments, students will not be allowed to leave the room. Once you complete your assessment, you must remain in the classroom for the remainder of the block. **We will not interrupt classes to dismiss students.**

A bag lunch will be provided in the cafeteria during the break from 10:15 am until 10:35. The lunch will consist of a ham and cheese croissant, hummus meal, fruit, veggie.and juice.

NURSE**

As we are closing out the 2023-2024 school year, please read the following information. *Medication in the clinic: If your student has medication in the clinic, this needs to be picked up by you, the parent, by the last day of school (May 23) at 1230p or the medication will be destroyed. Parents, you should have already received a call from me or I have left a

voicemail for a call back regarding this. *Care Plans in the clinic: If your student has a Care Plan in the clinic (Diabetes, Asthma, Allergies, Seizures, Medications, etc) I will be mailing out new Care Plans and forms to you for the 2024-2025 school year at the end of this month. Please be on the lookout for these and have them filled out and ready before/by the first day of school. *If your student has medication they will need to keep in the clinic for the 2024-2025 school year, you need to have a form filled out by you and the provider before the medication can be kept in the clinic. *Medication Forms and Care Plans can be found on the RCPS website if needed.

Rising 12th graders:

It is a Virginia State Requirement for school-aged children to have the Meningococcal Conjugate (MenACWY) vaccine prior to their entry into 12th grade. There is more than one Meningococcal vaccine so make sure your student is receiving the correct one. As of now, 60% of the rising 12th graders still need the vaccine.

The Meningococcal Conjugate (MenACWY) can be received at your primary care provider office or the local health department. Roanoke County Health Department - Vinton Branch (540) 857-7800. You will need to call and schedule an appointment with them.

If your student has had the Meningococcal vaccine before the age of 16, they will still need another before entering 12th grade. If your student has not had the Meningococcal vaccine, they will need it, and WBHS needs the proper documentation prior to the start of the 2024-2025 school year. Phone calls or notes from parents are not acceptable forms of meeting this requirement. Please meet this requirement as soon as possible.

- 1-Proof of having the Meningococcal vaccine after the 16th birthday
- 2-A notarized religious exemption form with a raised seal and registration number (no copies will be accepted)
- 3-Medical exemption form signed by the PCP indicating the permanent exemption on the VA School Health Form

You may submit your student's immunization record via fax to 540-890-7568 or it can be mailed to: School Nurse, William Byrd High School, 2902 Washington Ave, Vinton, VA 24179. You can email vaccine report to awood@rcps.us and I can let you know if it is acceptable or not. You may also opt to hand deliver it to WBHS in the summer. You can drop them off Monday-Thursday 9a-4p and have the front office place in the nurse's mailbox.

The school division has the right to **EXCLUDE** your student from school if this requirement is not met. Your student will **NOT** be able to start school for the 2024-2025 school year without this immunization. If your student is doing virtual learning, he/she will **NOT** get access to start their classes.

We are now issuing the DMV Learners Permit test at William Byrd High School and our next testing session has been scheduled.

The next test session will take place on MONDAY, MAY 20TH AT 3:30PM in the WBHS Library. Registration is available from the link provided in the parent letter attached to this email. **YOUR STUDENT MUST BE REGISTERED TO TAKE THE TEST!** Students must also bring the paper copy of the consent letter to test as well. If your student has tested previously here at Byrd, they will need to register **AGAIN** for this particular test and bring a new consent form.

Your student must be at least 15 years and 6 months on or before the test date. We will continue to offer this test once a month here at William Byrd. Once a student has failed the test twice, they will be required to test at the DMV.

Students will need a ride home at the end of the test - test typically takes 30-60 min.

Please reach out if you have any questions.

In order to test:

1. Register with link provided on parent letter attached to this email
2. Student must download the DMV Securitest Icon on school computer (directions attached) before entering testing site
3. Get parent consent signed (paper attached or can get from Ms. Thornton at school) - students will not be able to test without them
4. Be on time to test session.

Dear Parent or Legal Guardian:

William Byrd High School is pleased to announce that students can take the Virginia DMV learner's permit test online at the school. Students will be eligible to test if they are 15 years 6 months or older on the following date:

Monday, May 20, 2024 at 3:30pm in the WBHS Library

Steps to complete the process:

- Register for this test event at https://vadmexam.com/AT_Remote/ApplicantPortal/ApplicantPortal.aspx (Internet Explorer 9 or higher or Safari).
- A customer number is not required, but if you have a DMV ID card you must enter the name, DOB and customer number exactly as it appears on your DMV ID card. Otherwise, enter your full legal name and date of birth and leave the customer number field blank.
- Please provide a parent or student's email to receive registration confirmation, test results, notification of changes to the date and time or cancellation of the test event.
- Before taking the two part knowledge test, please STUDY the Driver's Manual located on DMV's web site using the following link: <http://www.dmv.virginia.gov/drivers/#manual.html>

On the test date please bring:

- Completed, and signed DTS 41 consent form. The form is available at <http://www.dmvnow.com/webdoc/pdf/dts41.pdf> or from the driver education teacher. This form has been attached to this email as well.
- A picture ID to verify identity. If the student does not have a picture ID, take a picture, write the student's full legal name under the picture, and have a teacher sign to verify the student's identity. (We will take care of this if student goes to WBHS).
- The student will be issued a test receipt after passing the learner's permit test. Take this receipt to DMV to apply for the learner's permit and to expedite the application process within 6 months or a retest is required.

At the DMV customer service center:

- the student must prove that they are 15 years and 6 months old
- pass a vision test
- provide DMV approved documents to prove residency and identity, http://www.dmv.virginia.gov/drivers/#applying_learners.asp
- take a picture
- pay the fee for the learner's permit and driver's license.

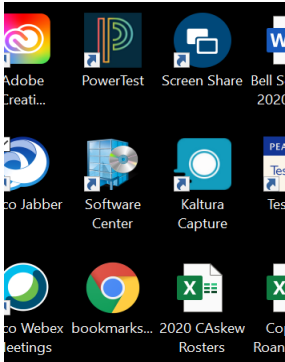

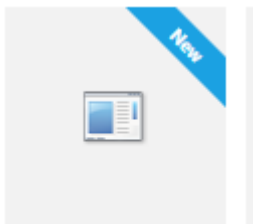

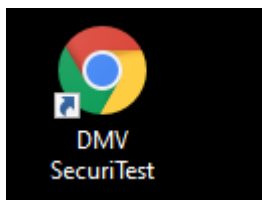

When?

Check-in at the back staging area of the Civic Center by **1:30 pm!** The ceremony begins at 2:30 pm. You will check in with your faculty line leader when you get there. If you are not checked in by line-up, we pull your diploma and you **DO NOT** walk.

What do I wear?

Business Casual attire is required.

YES: slacks/dress shirts, dresses,

shorts

NO: flip flops, work boots

What do I bring?

Your cap, tassel, gown, collar, and any school issued regalia approved by administration.

NEW CLEAR BAG POLICY FOR ALL EVENTS AT THE SALEM CIVIC CENTER, SALEM STADIUM & THE SALEM FAIR

Fans are strongly encouraged to carry as few items as possible when coming to the Salem Civic Center. Here are the types of bags that are permitted:

- Bags that are made of clear plastic, vinyl, or PVC
- Clear bags that are not larger than 12" tall x 6" deep x 12" wide.
- One-gallon plastic freezer bags (a Ziploc bag or similar)
- Small clutch bags, approx. 5.5" tall x 8.5" wide, with or without a handle or strap.
- Exceptions will be made for medically necessary items, but only after a proper inspection at an entrance that is specifically designated for this purpose.

Prohibited items include, but are not limited to, diaper bags, purses larger than a clutch bag, coolers, briefcases, backpacks, fanny packs, cinch bags, luggage of any kind, computer bags, camera bags or any bag larger than the permissible size.

Fans can still bring allowed items into the venue such as non-professional cameras, binoculars, and smart phones, if they are stored in a pocket or an allowed clear bag. Working personnel, including credentialed media members, must continue to enter the venue through designated entrances where they will be subject to screening and bag inspections.

Approved Bags



Small clutch bag, approximately the size of your hand. With or without strap.



Clear plastic, vinyl, or PVC bag.
No diaper bags or backpacks allowed unless clear and meeting new guidelines.

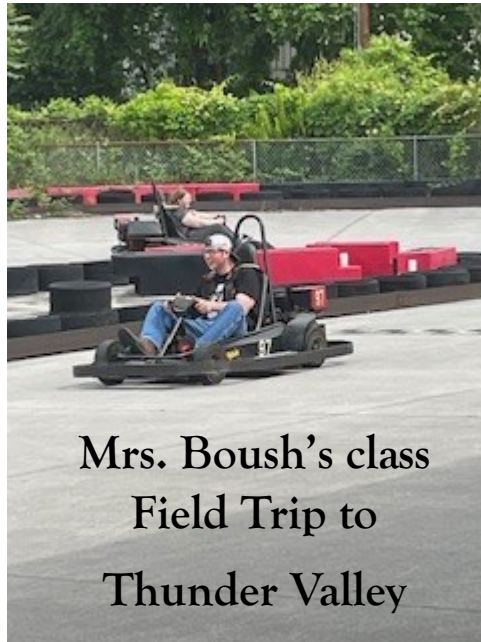
StudentVue access will be shut off in July and reissued by parents filling out first-day ANVER forms on ParentVue.
