




STUDENT DRESS CODE

Roanoke County Public Schools respects students' rights to express themselves in the way they dress. All students who attend Roanoke County Public Schools are also expected to respect the school community by dressing appropriately for a K-12 educational environment. Student attire should facilitate participation in learning as well as the health and safety of students and the adults that supervise them. This policy is intended to provide guidance for students, staff, and parents.

Minimum Requirements:

- 1. Clothing must cover areas from one armpit across to the other armpit, down to approximately 3 to 4 inches in length on the upper thighs (see images below). Tops must have shoulder straps. Rips or tears in clothing should be lower than the 3 to 4 inches in length.
- 2. Shoes must be worn at all times and should be safe for the school environment (pajamas, bedroom shoes or slippers shall not be worn, except for school activities approved by the principal).
- 3. See-through or mesh garments must not be worn without appropriate coverage underneath that meet the minimum requirements of the dress code.
- 4. Headgear including hats, hoodies, and caps are not allowed unless permitted for religious, medical, or other reason by school administration.



5. Specialized courses may require specialized attire, such as sports uniforms or safety gear.

Additional Requirements:

- 1. Clothing may not depict, imply, advertise, or advocate illegal, violent, or lewd conduct, weapons, or the use of alcohol, tobacco, marijuana or other controlled substances.
- 2. Clothing may not depict or imply pornography, nudity, or sexual acts.
- 3. Clothing may not display or imply vulgar, discriminatory, or obscene language or images.
- 4. Clothing may not state, imply, or depict hate speech/imagery targeting groups based on race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, religious affiliation, or any other protected classification.
- 5. Sunglasses may not be worn inside the building.
- 6. Clothing and accessories that endanger student or staff safety may not be worn.
- 7. Apparel, jewelry, accessories, tattoos, or manner of grooming that, by virtue of its color, arrangement, trademark or any other attribute, denotes membership in a gang that advocates illegal or disruptive behavior is prohibited.

The administration at each school reserves the right to determine what constitutes appropriate dress. Students who do not adhere to these guidelines will not be allowed to attend class. Parents will be called if appropriate clothing is not available or the student refuses dress-code appropriate clothing..

The dress code will be enforced the first day of school

Attendance Procedures

*Refer to RCPS policy for Excused Absences and Tardies

To notify the school of an absence, you may call 562-3700 ext. 24008 and leave a voice message with the students name, grade and reason for absence. PLEASE NOTE THAT THE PHONE CALL DOES NOT EXCUSE THE ABSENCE! The call lets us know you are aware of your child's absence and prevents us from calling you. A written acceptable excuse (in compliance with RCPS policy) must be submitted to the attendance office when the student returns to school.

CHECK OUT PROCEDURES

Please note that students cannot be checked out of school per a phone call. In order to check your student out, you must use one of the following options:

- 1) Send a written note to the school with the student that indicates the student name, reason for check out and the time to be dismissed along with the parent/guardian's contact number and signature. The note should be turned in to the attendance office when the student arrives at school. At that time, a check out pass will be issued that allows the student to leave at the designated time.
- 2) Send an email to wbhsattendance@rcps.us that includes the information in bullet #1.
- 3) Send a fax to 540-890-7568 that includes the information in bullet #1.
- 4) An authorized emergency contact may come to the school with a PHOTO ID and sign the student out at the attendance window. Only persons listed on the student's emergency card will be allowed to sign the student out.

COLLEGE VISITS/OUT OF TOWN TRIPS

A minimum of two days prior written notice must be submitted to the attendance office for college visits or out of town trips to be considered excused. Once submitted, the student will be issued a Prior Notice Form that must be signed by all teachers and returned to the attendance office prior to the absence. Failure to follow these procedures will result in the absence(s) being unexcused.

Teacher #2—Ms. Sullivan




Teacher #2—Mr. Adams

Make up Partnering for the Privilege meeting set for November 29th —7:00 pm in WBHS Auditorium

As our teenagers prepare for the privilege of driving, it's imperative that we do all we can to ensure their safety and the safety of those with whom they share the road. Nine out of ten teen drivers identify their parents as

having the greatest influence on their driving behaviors. With that in mind, parents and future teen drivers are invited to attend together one of the Partnering for the Privilege, Safe Teen Driving presentations offered at the Roanoke County high schools.

These presentations bring together parents, students, schools, law enforcement, and community resources in an effort to promote safe and responsible driving. The programs are open to the public but the target audience includes students who are taking Driver Education or those preparing for the licensing process this school year and their parents/guardians.

The program agenda will include:

- The unique characteristics and risks of teen drivers
- The important role parents play in the teen driving experience
- An overview of the driver education program
- Teen traffic laws and the graduated licensing restrictions
- Insuring the teen driver
- A parent's perspective of a teen crash



Students from drivers education classes this year are required to attend – parents are encouraged but can opt out by submitting form to teacher sent home with student. The programs begin at 7:00 p.m. and are approximately ninety minutes long.

Drivers Education classes partnered with Virginia Tech Transportation Institute to allow students to experience the No Zones from a tractor trailer. In this hands on experience, students were able to climb up in the a tractor trailer to get first hand experience to the lack of visibility for CDL drivers. Safety is vital when sharing the road with tractor trailers.

10th **graders and New to Roanoke County Public School Students**: We recently had Hearing and Vision Screenings. If you received a letter in the mail from the school about a concern, please send the letter back signed by parent/guardian with the appropriate box checked. If you have any questions or concerns about the letter you have received, please call the school and ask to speak with the nurse.

<u>Current 11th graders:</u> Before your student can start their senior year, he/she will need to get the Meningococcal ACWY vaccine. There is more than one kind of meningitis vaccine, so it is important that you indicate this exact one. Your PCP can provide this vaccine or the Vinton Health Department at 540-857-7800. You may email your student's immunization record to awood@rcps.us, fax it to 540-890-7568 or your student can drop it off at the clinic or front office to be placed in the nurse mailbox. Do not wait till the last minute to get this vaccine. It can be difficult at times to get appointments, especially at the last minute. This vaccine can be given after the 16th birthday. If your student is 16 years old, reach out to their provider or the Health Department to get this vaccine.

Don't forget to bring a water bottle to school daily! The filling stations/water fountains are open throughout the day. Water helps with hydration, headaches, cough, some stomachaches, sore throats and so much more.

Students can carry cough drops at school. We have a limited amount in the clinic as we rely on donations of cough drops. If you would like to donate some cough drops to the clinic, please have your student bring them to the clinic.

Remember, students in High School can carry a dose of OTC medication during the day. If you want your student to carry a dose of Tylenol, Motrin, Tums, etc., please stop by the nurse in the morning before school starts to get the form. Forms will not be given during class times. It will need to be filled out and signed by the parent/guardian and returned to the nurse. If there are any issues or concerns, we will notify you.
