Supporting Student Achievement

Title I is a federally funded program that began in 1965 to help ensure that all children have the opportunity to reach proficiency on challenging state academic standards and assessments. As the largest federal program supporting education, Title I provides funding that may be used to provide additional instructional staff, professional development, extended time programs and other strategies for raising student achievement.

Providing Licensed Teachers

Licensed teachers provide Title I instructional support by typically working with students in small groups in reading and/or math outside of the classroom.

Title I teachers collaborate closely with the classroom teachers to plan lessons that will reinforce the learning that is taking place in the classroom. Title I teachers use a variety of materials and strategies to help students meet grade level standards.

- Title I provides personalized instruction to individuals and/or small groups.
- The extra help is in addition to, not in place of, the regular curriculum instruction.
- Students receive Title I services at times other than during their core reading and/or math instructional times.
