# **Featured SAVE Promise Clubs**



### **Price Middle School** Atlanta, GA

During *Say Something* Week, the students at Price Middle School participated in an activity called "Stopping Violence Around the World." The activity allowed students to foster a culture of inclusivity and empathy by asking their classmates to join hands to show solidarity and compassion. Their efforts created a safer school environment and inspired positive change beyond their walls, proving that united, we can strive for a world free from violence.

### California High School San Ramon, CA

During their last meeting of the year, Jade Owens, Club President and National Youth Advisory Board Member, shares the importance of mental health: "Finals week isn't easy for anyone. It can be stressful. My Club shared how unsure and overwhelmed they feel about finals week. So, as a result, we chose to make a goal card. When it's on paper, it helps us collect our thoughts better, rather than keep it all up in our heads. Finals week is stressful, but it's also important to make sure you get what you need to be present for your testing. Eat well, get lots of sleep, and if you need any additional support—reach out to a trusted adult or friend."





### **Richmond Early College High School** Hamlet, NC

The students at Richmond Early College High School organized a spoken word event. The event encouraged students to write a poem, monologue, or autobiography incorporating SAVE Promise Club related themes including *Start With Hello*, embracing diversity, inclusion, kindness, compassion, empathy, and serving as an Upstander. Students presented their work during a school assembly, which allowed them to share their SAVE Promise Club experience with the entire student body.
