Art Club (Grades 1-3, 4-6)

This class welcomes students of all abilities to create fun works of art while team building, problem solving, and learning to use new materials. This year we have many exciting projects planned, including giant art projects which will be proudly exhibited at school events.



Art Club (Grades 7-10)

Art club is the time to learn new techniques and create fun stuff! Students will receive tutorials in illustration, painting, drawing, and sculpting and will have time to experiment with these approaches. The club will then work on projects over a period of weeks to produce a final, holistic artwork. Our inspiration will be not only major artists but cartoons as well!



Basketball Club

Boys Team: Grade 9-12

Girls Team: Grades 7-12

General Club: Grades 4-6, 7-9

The elementary basketball club is an introduction to the sport. The Middle/High level compete in community tournaments. The primary goal of our club is to teach students the basics of basketball and develop these skills even for players at the highest level. Students will learn hard work, persistence and confidence through the sport's teamwork.



Chess Club (Grades 1-3, 4-6 & 7-12)

The magic of Chess will be introduced in detail to all the students who will choose this extremely interesting activity. They will play games with their peers while they will learn rules, strategies, and tricks of one of the most intellectual clubs.



Creative Writing Club (Grades 7-12)

The Creative Writing Club offers a year-long journey into the world of storytelling, poetry, and literary expression. Students will explore their creativity through writing workshops, peer review sessions, and discussions to craft their own original stories, poems, and scripts for school publications. Young writers: prepare to bring your imaginations to life!



Comic Book Club (Grades 1-3)

During the Comic Book club, children will draw and write a short story about their favorite superhero or even invent a new one. They will make their own comic book and present it in the Comic Con exhibition.



Dance Club (Grades 4-6, 7-12)

Dance classes are one of the most diverse after school activities: from jazz to hip hop to ballet, your child is sure to find a class that interests them and matches their unique personality. Dance is also a great physical activity that will help students enhance their flexibility, physical strength, range of motion, stamina, and even improve their posture. This club provides the perfect environment for students to socialize and practice their interpersonal skills. It is an inherently team-centered activity that requires students to work in a group setting and emphasizes unity.



Disney Deconstructed (Grades 9-12)

Students will use Disney movies to explore social psychology concepts such as conformity, obedience, group behavior, and stereotypes. They will select their favorite Disney characters and analyze their personalities using psychological theories, such as the Big Five personality traits while considering the characters' background, motivations, fears, and goals. Students will present moral dilemmas faced by Disney characters and will discuss what they would do in those situations, linking to Kohlberg's stages of moral development.



Drama Club (Grades 4-6)

In the Drama Club, students will participate in a variety of activities that will help them learn to work as an ensemble to bring stories to life. They will explore the world of the stage using their voices, bodies, and emotions to develop and create compelling characters, settings, and scenarios. They will be challenged to use their imaginations in improvisational games and scene work. Finally, they will share all they have learned with the school community in performances throughout the year.



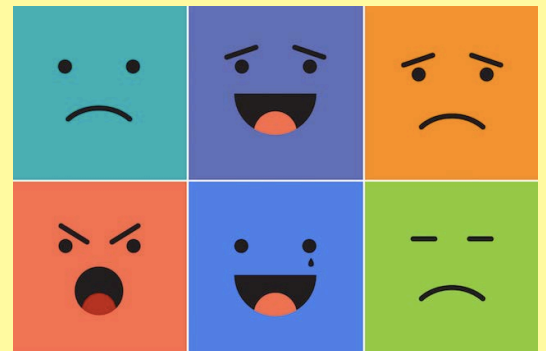
Ellinomatheia (Grades 7-12)

This after-school activity is designed to prepare students for the Ellinomatheia exams, focusing on developing proficiency in the Greek language. Through interactive lessons, practice tests, and engaging activities, students enhance their reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills. The curriculum is tailored to different proficiency levels, ensuring personalized support and targeted improvement. Together we will achieve success in the Ellinomatheia exams and deepen our understanding of Greek language and culture.



Emotions Club (Pre-K & Kindergarten)

In this club, students will explore their emotions, they will connect with them and get to know themselves more. They will understand the world around them, they will engage in mindful art, like mandalas and through activities, they will learn how people express their emotions and in which situations. A lot of social activities, for team bonding and collaboration will take place.



Environmental Club (Pre-K & Kindergarten)

Environmental club offers Pre-K and Kindergarten students a fun and educational experience focused on environmental awareness. Through activities like gardening, recycling, and storytelling, children will learn about the world and how to protect it while developing a global mindset by exploring diverse customs. Join us in nurturing young eco-heroes!



Fashion Design (Grades 8-12)

The Fashion Design After-School Club is a creative and dynamic space where students passionate about fashion can explore and develop their design skills. In this club, members engage in various activities ranging from sketching and designing clothes to learning about fabric selection, pattern making, and sewing techniques. Students are encouraged to express their personal style and collaborate on projects that allow them to bring their ideas to life.



Forensics Club (Grades 5-6, 7-12)

Pinewood is one of the founding members of the Panhellenic Forensics Association and has a strong tradition at high school level. Students will be introduced to events such as Debate, Group Discussion and Oral Interpretation. Higher level forensic events include Original Oratory, Impromptu Speaking and Duet Acting. Students will choose one or more events and will prepare for the Annual Panhellenic Tournament, which is hosted either in Athens or Thessaloniki. This training encourages all students to speak with structured thoughts and well supported arguments. They will develop not only their dramatic and non-dramatic skills but also their confidence and self-expression.



Formula 1 (Grades 7-12)

The Pinewood F1 Club is an engaging after-school activity for students passionate about Formula 1. This club offers members the opportunity to explore their favorite drivers, create articles on F1 history and legendary figures, and discuss the current state of the sport. In addition to producing content like race reports and news updates, students will delve into the rich history of Formula 1, examining past races, iconic drivers, and world champions. The club is ideal for students interested in motorsports journalism, helping them develop skills in writing, research, and discussion, while staying actively engaged with the world of F1.



Fun Friends (Pre-K & Kindergarten)

This program helps guide the social and emotional development of children ages 4-6 by using play - based group activities. By developing resilience skills early, children build confidence and create positive relationships with family and friends. Children will learn how to help others, understand feelings, engage and relate to peers, and be confident enough to cope with stress and fear.



Glee Club (Grades 3-6, 7-10, Adults)

A glee club is a musical / choir group, historically of mixed male and female voices, which traditionally specializes in the singing of short songs—glees—by trios or quartets. Glee songs often consist of a number of short, musically contrasted movements and their texts can be convivial, fraternal, idyllic, tender, philosophical or even (occasionally) dramatic.



Greek Dancing Club (Grades 1-3)

One of our newest clubs is sure to leave you jumping for joy! Learn traditional dances, embrace local Greek culture, and have fun moving to lively music. Perfect for young students eager to explore rhythm and heritage in a joyful, interactive environment.



Happiness Lab (Grades 1-4)

In this after school activity, children will discover how to live a happier and more fulfilling life, by feeling less stressed, and flourishing more, building a set of tools for feeling better and building healthier habits. We will explore behaviors, thoughts, and feelings that boost happiness. We will talk about mindfulness, fight-or-flight response, and stress.



Interactive Games (Pre-K & Kindergarten)

Gamesmanship will be balanced between deliberate play, free play and board games on rainy days. Students will practice motor skills (walking, running, jumping, balance, and strength) which will help the children to gain bodily strength, confidence and the ability to perform more complex skills in the future. It is often solitary but when sufficient resources are provided, it can also be a cooperative activity.



Interactive Storytelling (Pre-K & Kindergarten)

Interactive Storytelling will entail both interactive dramatic readings and improvisations/drama games, based on or inspired by, selected works of children's literature. With our source material ranging from iconic Gianni Rodari's playful stories, to folk fairy tales from the participants' countries of origin, we will dive into everything that amuses, excites and moves us in storytelling and story-listening!



Jewelry Club (Pre-K, Kinder & Grades 1-2, 4-6)

Students will have amazing opportunities to sharpen their creativity and aesthetics. We learn how to create necklaces, bracelets, crowns, and other decorative pieces depending on the season or unique festivity. Our "little pieces of art" are the reflection of each personality, but are also products of team collaboration. The combination of colors, techniques, materials, as well as the fresh ideas of each group, makes our club inspiring and entertaining!



Journalism Club (Grades 4-6, 8 -12)

Journalism is a creative way for students to engage with our community life about their personal interests and share key news events that happen in and out of school. The Elementary club will produce the quarterly publication "PineSays" while the Middle/High will produce "Pineword", magazines for the students by the students. Members can include writers, cartoonists, photographers, spokespeople who advocate for worthwhile causes, and more. Students will enjoy fun and exciting activities while also learning practical journalism, research, interviewing, and writing skills to last a lifetime.



Junior Art Club (Pre-K)

All young children are artists and this club develops their natural spontaneous creativity. Fine motor skills and observation are honed while at the same time students make beautiful art. Children are encouraged to explore colors, textures, shapes and to use a variety of techniques and materials to enhance their overall development. Free expression and directed drawing complement each other in a stimulating, fun, and educational environment.



Junior Dance Club (Grades 1 - 3)

Welcome to the world of dance! Our top priority is fun, so that kids come out with a positive dance experience. The Junior Dance Club aims to help children develop their confidence, coordination and collaboration with their friends through dance. Children learn dances accompanied by their favorite pop songs and choreograph their own short pieces. Performing is a very exciting aspect of dance and for this reason Pinewood organizes regular dance assemblies and student performances so that students' teachers and parents can see what they have achieved!



Lego Club (Pre-K & Kindergarten)

Lego club is a social development program that uses lego activities to develop social skills in groups. In this club, three or four children take on a specific role and work together to build a lego model. Using this format provides each child with an opportunity to practice and develop a wide range of skills, including language skills (in both giving and receiving instructions), turn-taking, negotiating, sharing and collaborative social problem- solving. It also encourages children to reflect on their own actions, abilities, and feedback from their peers.



Little Explorers (Pre-K & Kindergarten)

How would you walk if you were a broccoli? If you were an apple, where would we find you? How would you feel if you were a kiwi? Come join us for a tasteful, healthy adventure around the world! Little Explorers will learn all about fruit and vegetables, where they grow and how they affect our bodies with a hands-on, creative experience.



Managers Club (Grades 9-12)

We are strong supporters of business and financial literacy, and we believe in creating lifetime management skills for students to succeed in their careers. Our students will be introduced to concepts such as demand and supply, money, banks, savings, investments, stock markets, derivatives, consumer behavior and neuromarketing. 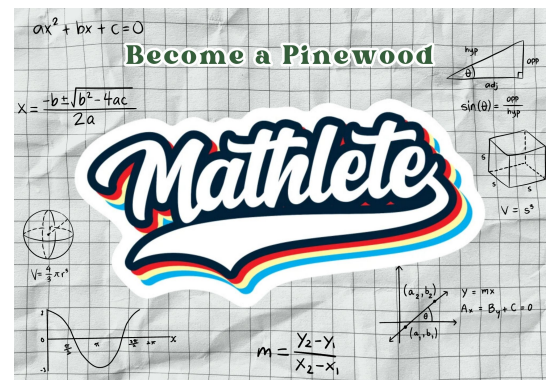
Martial Arts (Grades 4-6)

Pinewood participates in conferences in Greece and overseas where student delegates are placed in committees and assigned countries or organizations to represent. Delegates conduct research before conferences, formulate positions and come up with policy proposals that they will then debate with their fellow delegates in the committee, staying true to the actual position of the member they represent.



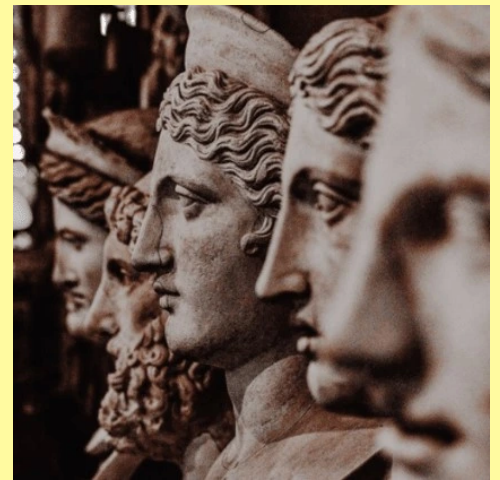
Music Club (Pre-K, Kindergarten & Grades 1-6)

Python Club (Grades 7-10)

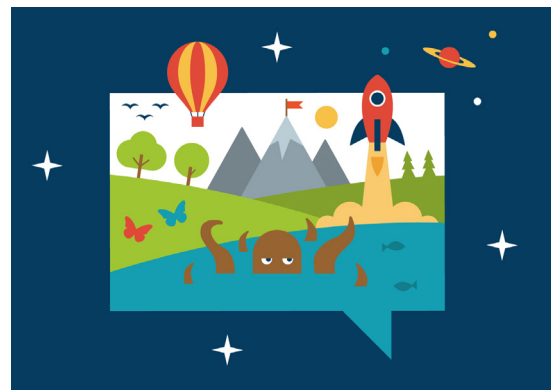
Tennis Club (Grades 3-4, 5-6)

STEAM CLUB

Grades 1-2

Imagine a world of bolts, spanners, weaving looms, LEGO sets, and a variety of materials and equipment introduced to students designed to familiarize them to tool use. They will have the opportunity to enrich and explore these concepts further during the morning activities of the new Pinewood STEAM program. The Club's activities scaffold students' spatial skills, teamwork, algorithmic, and embodied thinking.

Grades 3-4

At this level, students concentrate on designing and building solutions to practical problems. After an introduction to tools, materials, and mechanisms, students find solutions to real-world problems through artifacts. They have the chance to enrich and explore these problems and solutions further during the morning activities of the new Pinewood STEAM program. The completed projects will be displayed in competitions and shows around the school where students will have the chance to discuss their work.

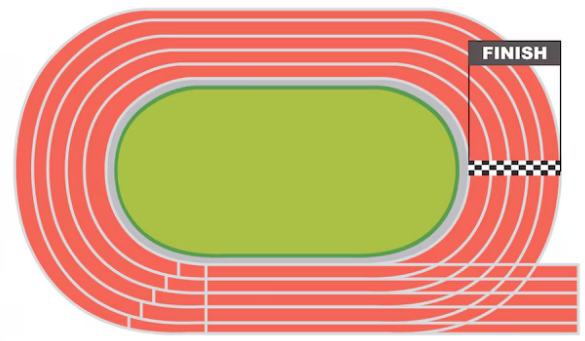
Grades 5-6

This level of STEAM combines a study of digital and physical tools. Once the familiarization with hand tools and materials has been completed, students are then introduced to digital environments for the production of artifacts and applications. They have the opportunity to enrich and explore these concepts further during their morning activities of the new Pinewood STEAM program. The club will participate in selected events and competitions such as the National 3D Design Competition, where Pinewood's STEAM Club won the National Design Award.

We teach our students to push beyond their comfort zone, be disciplined, confident and a positive team player by instilling supportive sportsmanship.



Wellbeing Ambassadors (Grades 4-6, 7-10)

This program serves to train and recruit wellbeing ambassadors for the Pinewood campuses. The ambassadors are student volunteers who promote positivity, a caring mentality, and overall well-being within the school community alongside students, teachers, school psychologists, and principals. Training includes mindfulness, emotion regulation, peer mediation, first aid, art therapy, and mental health warning signs. Students who successfully complete their training with 80% attendance will be certified Wellness Ambassadors.



World Physics Cup (Grades 8-10)

The World Physics Cup club consists of year-long preparation for the International Young Naturalists' Tournament (IYNT). Students ages 12-16 design creative experiments, collect and analyze data, prepare presentations, and focus on debating. In past years, the IYNT has been hosted in countries such as Turkey, Russia, China and Georgia. No matter where next year's tournament is hosted, Pinewood is up to the challenge!
