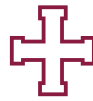

THE SCHOOL

Founded in 1842, Saint James School is a coeducational, Episcopal boarding school with a smaller day student program. Located in central Maryland on a 100-acre campus surrounded by 700 acres of school-owned farm land, Saint James is five miles south of Hagerstown and 70 miles from both Washington, DC and Baltimore. Our students come to us from 16 states and territories, including the District of Columbia, and from 21 countries. Of these, 29 percent are domestic students of color, and 29 percent are international students. The School prides itself on offering a personalized approach to learning in a diverse and inclusive environment. As a result of the strong tradition of academic excellence, with competitive athletics and a full program in the arts, Saint James School challenges its students to grow academically, athletically, artistically, socially, and morally.

Saint James School is accredited by the Association of Independent Maryland Schools, Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools, and approved by the Maryland State Board of Education. Professional and academic affiliations include NAIS, NAES, NACAC, PCACAC, ACCIS, CSEE, College Board, and the Cum Laude Society.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT POLICY STATEMENT

Saint James School offers 19 Advanced Placement (AP) courses. Students typically begin taking AP classes beginning in Fifth Form (11th Grade). It is very rare for a student to have AP courses prior to Fifth Form. AP courses are only offered to students with high academic ability and with the recommendation of the teaching faculty in the subject area of course interest. It is common for some of our best students to have only a few Advanced Placement classes on their transcript.
