

## Prescription medicine

Many medicines prescribed at the Well@Work clinic will be available at no cost.

### **Why is Well@Work providing free medicine?**

As an added benefit for our patients, Well@Work will provide eligible employees no cost generic prescriptions commonly prescribed at our clinic. Our goal is to help our patients save money and support their health goals with the added convenience of getting their medicine at the clinic.

### **What medicines are being offered?**

Many of the medicines commonly prescribed by Well@Work will be available in generic form, including antibiotics, anti-inflammatories, blood pressure and cholesterol medicine and more.

### **What medicines will NOT be offered?**

Narcotic pain, specialty and brand-name medicines are not available at the Well@Work clinic, but can be filled through your local pharmacy. The cost of these medicines will vary depending on your pharmacy benefit.

### **Can I get medicines for other conditions not being treated at Well@Work?**

No. Medicines will only be available for conditions being treated at the Well@Work clinic. We encourage you to make an appointment at the clinic to discuss your specific needs.

### **Can I bring in prescriptions from an outside physician to be filled at Well@Work?**

No. Well@Work is not set up as a full-service pharmacy and will only have a limited number of generic medicines in stock.

### **Can I call the clinic to get medicines from Well@Work?**

No. Well@Work cannot prescribe or dispense medicine for patients not actively treating at the Well@Work clinic.

### **Where can get more information?**

We encourage you to make an appointment at the clinic to discuss your specific needs. The program is designed to save time and money by offering common prescriptions on-site and is not intended to replace your regular pharmacy.
