- ½ unit of Physical Education
- ½ unit of Health
- ¼ unit of Oral Communication
- ¼ unit of Computer Science

IMPORTANT NOTES ABOUT STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

- Advanced Placement courses are ordinarily available *ONLY TO JUNIORS AND SENIORS*. Select freshmen are placed in AP World History. Admission to these courses is competitive and is based upon past performance/testing, and, in all cases, approval of the Instructor.
- Even the most rigorous senior schedule would rarely include more than 3-4 AP courses.
- Junior students may elect to enroll in United States History/Morality which is both a social studies class (US History) and a Religion class (Morality and Social Justice). This class also has a community service component.
