Dear Parents,

I wanted to share with you that the Ohio EPA has approved our plan to add a filtration system to the MS/ES water system. We applied to the EPA in late April and received the okay to move forward in August. The equipment has been ordered by Donomarc (the company that was hired to do the plan and project). The project will start as soon as the equipment arrives.

I am happy to share that our most recent sample also came in significantly lower which will push our MCL below the necessary 4 quarter average. The notice below is from the 2nd quarter reading (April/May/June) and should be our last letter about this issue.

As you know, we work closely with the Ohio EPA to ensure our drinking water meets all standards that they have put in place. January of 2006 marked a change in the federal and state drinking water rules on arsenic. On that date the maximum contaminant level (MCL) was reduced from .05 micrograms per liter (mg/L) to .01 (mg/L). Since that date, Triad Elementary School and Triad Middle School have typically been in compliance with EPA regulations during the school year, but on a few occasions levels have been higher during the summer months when buildings are empty due to a decrease in the use of water.

According to the Ohio EPA;

“Arsenic can be found in drinking water as a result of natural processes of human activities. Higher levels of arsenic tend to be found more often in ground water than in surface water. The main source of arsenic in ground water is natural weathering and erosion of rocks and minerals. Most arsenic found in Ohio’s ground water is naturally occurring.”

Triad, in conjunction with the Ohio EPA, drinking water specialists and our own maintenance staff, has been using a variety of methods to reduce the presence of arsenic in the drinking water. This year, 3 of our 4 quarterly sample levels have been under .01 (mg/L). However, due to the summer months mentioned above, our running 4 quarter average is still slightly above the MCL at .011 (mg/L) and as a result, we are required to send our community this drinking water notice.

“The current levels of arsenic do not pose an immediate health risk; however, some people who drink water containing arsenic in excess of the MCL over many years could experience skin damage or problems with the circulatory system, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer.” As a precaution, and because Triad will always put the welfare of the children first, parents are always welcome to send their student to school with a water bottle so they can use it during the school day.

Subject: Violation of Maximum Contaminant Level for ARSENIC

TRIAD MIDDLE SCHOOL is in violation for exceeding the maximum contaminant level (MCL) standard of 0.010 mg/L as established in the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) section 3745-81 for ARSENIC. Compliance with the MCL is based on a running annual average. The annual average for ARSENIC during the second quarter of 2024 time period is 0.012 mg/L.

To address the MCL violation, TRIAD MIDDLE SCHOOL is required to take the following actions:

1. Notify your customers within 30 days using the enclosed instructions and public notice.
2. Complete and send a verification form with a copy of the public notice to the mailing address below, or via email to YunYi.Thomas@epa.ohio.gov, within ten days after issuance.
3. Perform quarterly monitoring for ARSENIC according to your most recent monitoring schedule.
4. Consult with your Ohio EPA district representative to discuss your options for coming into compliance and establishing a compliance schedule or comply with any previously issued enforcement action.

Your prompt attention to this matter is greatly appreciated. Continued noncompliance may lead to additional enforcement actions. If you have any questions or wish to change the public notice, please call me at (614) 644-2752.
