The After Party is a video/discussion-based series presented by the clergy on Wednesday nights for the six weeks leading up to the election (Sept 25 - Oct 30, 5:30-7:00 PM). A small Agape meal will bring us together each week as we learn how to listen with love and put Christ at the center of our political discussions. The After Party is an invitation to model the virtues of hope and humility, bearing Christian witness to a broken and bitterly divided world.

What is it? The After Party is a 6-week video-based curriculum that promotes the development of a Christ-centered political identity amidst the current culture of toxic polarization we find our country in today. We will learn to listen with love, drop the "us vs. them" mentality that divides us, and move forward with a spirit of reconciliation - not fear.


What is it NOT? The After Party will NOT tell you how to vote, which party to support, or convert you to the "other side." The focus is not on the "what" of specific parties, policies, or politicians, but on the "how" of political engagement that Jesus teaches us — the virtues of humility, mercy, and justice.

We continue work on the pre-construction phase of our project and we are actively engaged in Design Development. The final building footprints for new construction have been established and the rooms have been incorporated into the floor plans with dimensions shown. Work on the Site Plan by the Civil Engineer continues. We have definitive direction from the City of Fairhope on how we will obtain Site Plan approval, and this is a big milestone! Our contractor selection process has been completed, and we anticipate that the selection will be announced publicly in the near future. The Architect has engaged design consultants for Structural, Mechanical, Electrical, Plumbing, and Fire Protection. These consultants have toured the existing facilities. Meetings with the Contractor will kick off next month and we will begin establishing structural systems, materials, and methods to be used for new construction.

Start your day with coffee, breakfast, and a devotional. Meets every Tuesday morning at 7:00 AM in Green Hall.


Tuesday Night Adult Bible Study: Resumes September 17

Monica Berney, organist

A true star among young classical musicians, Monica Berney has made a name for herself as one of the finest organists on the scene today. Known for her technical mastery, effortless musicality, and engaging stage presence, she has been inspiring audiences from coast to coast. Ms. Berney was appointed Director of Music at St. Paul's Parish, K Street (Washington, D.C.) in August 2023. Her robust leadership of



this celebrated music program has already generated ripples of excitement across church music spheres.



Friday, November 8 at 7:00pm Seraph Brass

Celebrating its tenth-anniversary season, Seraph Brass was founded by trumpet soloist Mary Elizabeth Bowden with a mission to showcase the excellence of female brass players and highlight musicians from marginalized groups, both in personnel and in programming. Winners of the American Prize in Chamber Music, the group has been praised for their "beautiful sounds" (American Record Guide), "fine playing" (Gramophone), and "staggeringly high caliber of performance" (Textura). Seraph primarily performs as a quintet, with a dynamic roster drawing from America's top brass musicians. Seraph Brass is a Yamaha Performing Group and performs exclusively on Yamaha instruments.

Jihye Chaṇq and Benjamin Sung

Husband and wife duo, Jihye Chang and Benjamin Sung will present a program of "Life in (and) Music" featuring works by Samuel Coleridge-Taylor, Antonín Dvořák, Amy Beach, Maurice Ravel and more!

Jihye Chang enjoys a diverse career as a soloist, collaborator, educator, scholar, and advocate for new music in the United States and abroad. Her performances focus on the creative process of collaborating with living composers, curating programs that connect to various audiences, and giving context to contemporary works. Chang graduated from Seoul National University and earned her Master's and Doctorate degrees from the Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University. She will join the esteemed piano faculty of Boston University as a Senior Lecturer in the Fall of 2024, after serving as a Visiting Assistant Professor at Florida State University. Chang is also a faculty member at the Brevard Music Center and the director of Piano Intensive Bulgaria.

Associate Professor of Violin at Florida State University, violinist Benjamin Sung is also a Faculty Artist at the Brevard Music Center, where he acts as Violin Coordinator and Concertmaster of the Brevard Opera Orchestra. Sung holds a Bachelor's degree from the Eastman School of Music, and Master's and Doctorate degrees from the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music.

Sunday, April 13 at 4:00pm Bob Chilcott's St. John Passion


performed by the St. James Choir with chamber orchestra and soloists

Chilcott's mighty setting of words from St. John's Gospel is a dramatic yet optimistic re-telling of the Passiontide story. Bob Chilcott has become one of the world's most widely performed composers and arrangers of choral music. His compositional output reflects his wide taste in music styles and his commitment to writing music that is both singable and communicative. He has been involved in choral music most of his life – he was a chorister and then a choral scholar in the choir of King's College, Cambridge, and was a member of the British vocal group The King's Singers. His most often performed pieces include Can you hear me?, A Little Jazz Mass, Requiem, and the St. John Passion.
