
SURPRISE WILDCAT FORMATION, FUMBLE RECOVERIES AID CROCKETT FOOTBALL COMEBACK

First, the BEST news: JaQarrius Hurdle, the Ripley receiver who was hurt in the last two minutes of the football game with Crockett County Friday night and was carried off the field on a stretcher, is reportedly "okay" now and dealing with nothing more serious than a sore neck. The Cavalier players and cheerleaders each prayed for Hurdle while he was being stabilized on the field by athletic trainer Carah-Beth Beck and a team of emergency responders, and we are grateful to report the positive outcome.

Now, the GOOD news: Crockett is off to a 2-0 start to the season, despite not having nearly approached its highest level of play.

Finally, the LESS GOOD news: It took a surprise offensive formation and two defensive fumble recoveries by the everalert Austin Carroll to make the 2-0 happen.

Coach Kevin Ward's Cavaliers looked a bit lackluster for much of Friday's contest, but after falling behind 14-3 with 8:38 remaining in the third quarter, scored the game's last 20 points and escaped with a 23-14 triumph over the visiting Tigers at Cavalier Stadium.

"We didn't play our best the first week against North Side, and we didn't play very well tonight either," Ward said after the game, "but I'm proud that these guys found a way to win. We didn't really have a good week of practice. The players didn't seem entirely focused, and we have to do a better job as coaches to keep that from happening. But wins are hard to come by, and we have two of them now."

Crockett fumbled away a pair of scoring chances in the first half – one near the Ripley goal line – and had another touchdown by Demo Pickens called back because of a holding penalty well behind the play. It was the first of two tallies by the snake-bit Pickens negated by holding infractions in the game.

So when Ripley scored with 1:15 left before intermission to take a 7-3 lead, and then scored again on its opening drive of the third quarter, the Cavaliers looked to be solidly seat-belted on the trouble bus.

But that's when Ward and his staff pulled out the "back pocket" portion of their offensive scheme. Senior speedster Deuce Greenhill – playing a wide receiver role this season after establishing himself as one of West Tennessee's top running backs in his first three years – took an end-around handoff from quarterback Ben Burgess, somehow escaped a gaggle of Tiger tacklers just past the line of scrimmage, and galloped 70 yards for a touchdown to put the hosts right back in the battle just 22 seconds after Ripley thought it was pulling away. Avery Hurst's extra point – he had scored Crockett's only points on the game's first possession with a 30-yard field goal – cut the Tiger margin to

Then, just seven plays later, Cavalier defenders Carroll and Willie (Dre) Walker combined for a hit on Ripley quarterback Sammie Smith, knocking the ball loose near midfield. Carroll pounced on it to give Crockett possession at the Cavalier 48.

This time - showing the Tigers yet another new wrinkle - Greenhill lined up in the "Wildcat" formation, a three-man horizontal backfield that offers a variety of options. He took a direct snap from Carroll (the Cav center) and immediately dashed 37 yards to the Ripley 15. After another three-yard "Wildcat" gain by Greenhill, Crockett shifted back to its power lineup for four straight linebucks by DK Woods, who totaled 87 yards on 20 carries during the contest.

Eventually, the Cavs couldn't score on a fourth-and-goal from the two, with the Tiger defense stiffening to pull down Gabe Dupree for no gain, and Ripley regained the ball.

But on the very next play – in the midst of a 14-yard gain by Ripley's Vernon Thompson – Crockett's Amarion Hobson rattled his cage with a jarring tackle, sending the ball onto the ground again. And – again – Carroll was there to cover it up and give the Cavs possession at the 17.

Pickens swept left for 11 yards on first down, and then Crockett went back into the Wildcat. A bobbled snap cost the Cavs a yard on the next play, but then Greenhill took the next one cleanly, faked a handoff to Woods going right, and then swept left end himself, where Willie (Dre) Walker and Karsen Burgess had sealed the only remaining defenders off with screen blocks. Greenhill waltzed into the end zone with 15 seconds left in the third period, and Hurst's extra made it 17-14, Crockett.

With the momentum now completely swinging back in favor of the hosts, Crockett's defense forced a Tiger punt on the next series. A 10-yard return by Pickens put the ball at the Cav 31. Two runs by Woods and a Ripley penalty advanced the ball to midfield, but after suffering a nine-yard sack, Ben Burgess rolled to his right to buy some time and then uncorked a 38-yard bomb to Walker down to the Tiger 21.

Following a three-yard loss on the ensuing play, the Cavs went back to a misdirection play out of the backfield, and Woods rambled 24 yards for what would be the game's final score with 7:16 remaining. The margin was sustained when both Walker and Greenhill picked off Smith pass attempts in the final 3:30.

Of the move to the Wildcat formation, Ward said, "We needed to do something to shake things up a little bit. It's something we practice off and on, and it's a good thing to have in your back pocket when you need it. With the backs we have, we certainly have the personnel to make it work. It was good to see it make a difference tonight."

Greenhill, who only touched the ball offensively twice in the 36-34 opening win over North Side, rushed nine times for 153 yards and two touchdowns, and caught three passes for 17 more yards in this one. Walker caught five passes for 90 yards in one of his best offensive showings.

Ripley's Smith ran for 84 yards on 19 keepers and scored both Tiger touchdowns, ironically on identical 19-yard bursts through the middle. Crockett outgained the visitors in total yardage 358 to 228.

Crockett will now go back on the road to face perhaps West Tennessee's most Jekyll-and-Hyde team of the first two weeks in Lexington Friday night. The Big Red steamrolled Scotts Hill 48-0 in their season opener, and then were held without a single first down in Week 2 when powerful Riverside pummeled them 35-0.


