What is CAASPP?




CAASPP stands for the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress. It's a system of statewide assessments designed to evaluate how well students in grades 3rd-8th and 11th are meeting the state's academic standards in English Language Arts/Literacy (ELA), mathematics, and Science.



What is reported on Student Score Reports?

Your child's individualized results from end-of-year statewide CAASPP assessments such as Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBAC) or California Science Test (CAST).



How to access your child's results?

Parents can access their child's report by logging onto the ATLAS Parent Portal. If you do not have access to the portal, please contact your child's school.



How are my child's results used for learning?

Results are used to pinpoint areas where students may need additional support in the coming school year. It's normal for students to have both academic strengths and areas that require more attention and improvement. These results are not used to decide whether a student will advance to the next grade.



How can I help my child?

You are an important part of your child's education. Explain to your child that these tests are used as tools to help them learn, and that they should not be anxious or scared. Remind your child that you and their teacher want them to try their very best and are there to help, every step of the way.
