

There are many pathways to becoming an educator. Here's a quick guide to...

Emergency 30-Day Substitute Teaching Permit (Substitute Teaching Permit) - CA

The Emergency 30-Day Substitute Teaching Permit authorizes the holder to serve as a day-to-day substitute teacher in any classroom in California, including preschool, kindergarten, and grades 1-12, or in classes organized primarily for adults. <u>CTC - 30 Day Substitute Teaching Permit</u>

Substitute teaching is a great way to better determine if teaching is the career for you as well as allowing you to get to know a school/district.

30-day substitute teacher permit allows the holder to serve as a substitute for no more than 30 days for any one teacher during the school year or no more than 20 days in a school year for a special education teacher

The Basic Skills Requirement (BSR) has changed! Many teacher candidates used to take the CBEST. Now a bachelor's degree from a regionally-accredited institution eliminates this requirement for most credentials and the 30-Day Substitute Teacher Permit. <u>CTC - Basic Skills</u> <u>Requirement</u>

If your degree is from outside the US, you must have your transcripts evaluated by an approved agency. <u>CTC - Foreian</u> Transcript Evaluation.
