

changed! Many teacher
candidates used to take the
CBEST. Now a bachelor's
degree from a
regionally-accredited
institution eliminates this
requirement for most
credentials.

<u>CTC - Basic Skills</u> <u>Requirement</u>

If your degree is from outside the US, you must have your transcripts evaluated by an approved agency. <u>CTC - Foreign</u> Transcript Evaluation.

You may or may not need to take California Subject Examinations for Teachers (CSET).
