Career Technical Education (CTE) Credential - CA For Holders of Another Clear Teaching Credential

The Preliminary Designated Subjects CTE Teaching Credential authorizes the holder to teach in the specific credential subject up to 12th grade and in classes organized primarily for adults, in career technical, trade or vocational courses. The Clear Designated Subjects CTE Teaching Credential authorizes the holder to teach English learners in Specially Designed Academic Instruction Delivered in English (SDAIE) as part of career technical, trade or vocational courses.

Clear CA teaching credential with at least one year of teaching experience while holding that START! credential (Multiple Subject, Single Subject, or **Education Specialist)** Total of 3 years/3000 hours of Industry experience and education combined (credentialed teaching experience = 1 year/1000 hours) Apply for CTE credential Offer of employment in a through a Designated AND CTE position for a Subjects/CTE Credential school/district program

While you are teaching you will also complete the following:

- Applicable CTE program courses
- CPR for infant, child and adult certification
- Verify one year of CTE teaching experience
