
There are many pathways to becoming an educator. Here's a quick guide to...

Single Subject Credential - CA

Credential used for departmentalized classes, such as those in most middle schools and high schools or in classes organized primarily for adults. It is also found in lower grades, particularly for subjects such as physical education or visual & performing arts (VAPA) subjects.

CTC - Basic Skills
Requirement

If your degree is from outside the US, you must have your transcripts evaluated by an approved agency. <u>CTC - Foreign</u> Transcript Evaluation.

You may or may not need to take California Subject Examinations for Teachers (CSET).
