


There are many pathways to becoming an educator. Here's a quick guide to...

Multiple Subject Credential - CA

Typically TK - 6th grade but can be used self-contained classrooms up to grade 12, or in classes organized primarily for adults

The Basic Skills Requirement (BSR) has changed! Many teacher candidates used to take the CBEST. Now a bachelor's degree from a regionally-accredited institution eliminates this requirement for most credentials. <u>CTC - Basic Skills</u> <u>Requirement</u>

If your degree is from outside the US, you must have your transcripts evaluated by an approved agency. <u>CTC - Foreign</u> <u>Transcript Evaluation</u>.

You may or may not need to take California Subject Examinations for Teachers (CSET). <u>CTC - Subject Matter</u> <u>Requirement</u>
