Please remember that school begins at 8:55am. We open our doors to allow children to enter the building at 8:40am. Staff are stationed throughout the building to guide students to their classrooms and monitor students eating breakfast in the cafeteria. There are three car lines out front of the school. The BUSH preschool Bears use the curbside line for safety. Hanby families are provided the middle and outside car lines for arrival and dismissal. If your child is a bus rider, you will receive information, by mail, from our transportation department regarding times and location of pick up and drop off. At the end of the day, dismissal begins at 3:35 with walkers dismissing first out of the back of the school, car riders dismiss from the gym, then buses are called individually by number. Please be patient as our students and staff get accustomed to the procedures. If you need to pick up your child for an early dismissal, please park and come into the building before 2:45pm, when possible. This will help keep our parking lot safe for students during dismissal.
