## The Role of School Counselors

#### Who are School Counselors?

School counselors are certified/licensed educators who improve student success for ALL students by implementing a comprehensive school counseling program.

#### LEADERSHIP TEAM MEMBERS School counselors work to maximize student all students. As viral members of the school leadership team, school counselors create a school culture of success for all.

School counselors help all students:

 apply academic achievement strategies
 manage emotions and apply interpersonal skills
 plan for postsecondary options (higher education, military, work force)

#### Appropriate duties include providing:

- individual student academic planning and goal setting
   school counseling classroom lessons based on student success standards
- short-term counseling to students
- referrals for long-term support
- collaboration with families/teachers/ administrators/ community for student success
- advocacy for students at individual education plan
- meetings and other student-focused meetings
- data analysis to identify student issues, needs and challenges
   acting as a systems change agent to improve equity and
- access, achievement and opportunities for all students






# Graduation Coach – Melissa Balser


## School Psychologist – Robert Shultz



A school psychologist is a specialized professional who works within educational settings to support the mental health, learning, and behavior of students. They play a crucial role in promoting students' overall well-being and helping them succeed academically, socially, and emotionally.

# 504/RTI Coordinator – Allison Herndon

504/RTI Coordinator in a high school is responsible for managing and overseeing the implementation of Section 504 plans and the Response to Intervention (RTI) process. Their primary goal is to ensure that students with disabilities or those struggling academically receive the appropriate support and accommodations to succeed in school.



## School Social Work - Brady Varga, LCSW

A school social worker is a professional who supports the social, emotional, and mental health needs of students, helping to create a positive and safe learning environment. They play a crucial role in bridging the gap between home, school, and the community, ensuring that students have the resources and support they need to succeed academically and personally.

Provides support to students and families to overcome the social, behavioral, emotional or economic problems that prevent learning

Follows up to assure that services are provided and conditions improve Makes appropriate referrals for professional and community services

Works closely with teachers and school administrators






