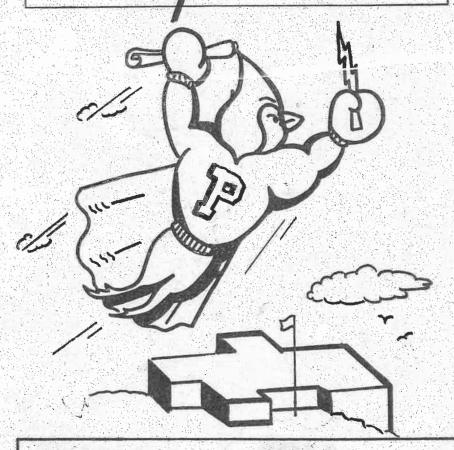

The TOPS Conference

From a simple beginning of three teams our present TOPS Conference now boasts of eight teams from the South and Southwest suburban area. The original group of Tinley Park, Orland Park, and Palos has grown to encompass St. Michaels (Orland Park), Arbor Park (Oak Forest), Arbury Hills (Mokena), Kirby (Tinley Park), Tinley Central, Conrady (Hickory Hills) and Orland Park Junior High.

A Conference committee meets regularly to discuss policy and schedules. Official Illinois High School Association referees are hired to officiate at all conference games. The Conference now sponsors basketball, wrestling and track events throughout the school year.

A very important tradition here at Palos is the necessary "eligibility" of prospective athletes. Faculty members report each two weeks on the academic and social progress of the prospective athlete.

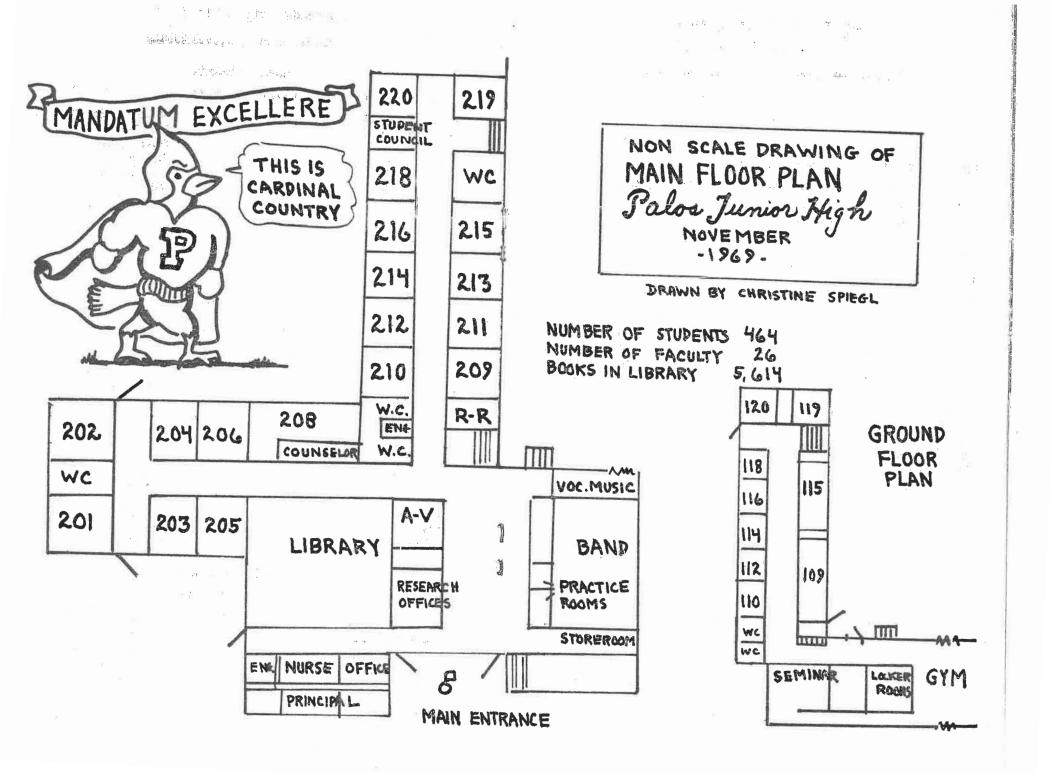

Clothing and Personal Dress Code

(Revised by the Student Council of the state of the Palos Junior High School)

Students usually behave in a manner consistent with their dress. For this reason, and in order to eliminate uncertainty, we establish the following rules to be followed by all Junior High students. These items have been worked out with the school administration at several meetings:

- 1. Boys should wear slacks (not overalls, blue jeans, work pants or shorts).
- 2. Cowboy boots or engineer boot are not to be worn.

 Cleats must not be worn.
- 3. Students' hair must be neatly groomed.
- Girls are allowed to wear dresses, skirts, or dress culottes.
 Permission must be obtained from Administration if other
 attire is desired.
- 5. Properly fitting clothing must be worn by all students:
- 6. Girls are NOT allowed to wear makeup.
- Gym shoes are to be worn in Physical Education classes only. Other rubber soled shoes may be worn if they are not used for gym. Street shoes and sandals are also appropriate for school.
- 8. Shirts and blouses may be worn outside of slacks and skirts, but boy's shirt-tails must be tucked in.
- Skirt lengths are a matter of personal taste, but should be long enough to maintain personal propriety and decorum when standing or sitting.
- Girls may wear slacks to school during cold weather, when temperature at 8:00 A.M. is 20° or below. This is in effect until spring recess (March 31.)

Because we have worked hard in order to get certain items included we feel that it is every student's responsibility to follow the above rules. Our Principal has accepted these as OUR OWN dress code and has agreed to enforce them as if they were part of the formalized school rules.
