The Health Mom


There is no typical day for Rachel Gonzales, in fact, not quite knowing where the day will take her is one of the reasons she enjoys her career in School Health.

"Every day is different," said Gonzales. "I always get to interact and build relationships with different students."

From helping with general first aid, to reaching out to parents, guardians, and keeping student's health files up-to-date, Rachel's day is filled with duties that are crucial to Creekside Middle School students health & safety.

"Sometimes the kids call me their health mom," said Rachel.

A six year employee of the District, Rachel first found her calling to become a School Health Assistant while working as a Yard Duty at Apricot Valley.



"Outside on the playground there were a lot of falls [and injuries] and I would help the Health Assistant over there. I started subbing for them and really enjoyed it."

Some of Rachel's job duties as a School Health Assistant include keeping immunization records up to date, maintaining documentation, health records, student medicine logs, keeping the health office stocked, informing staff of student doctors notes and exemptions, and providing support to the LVN's and RN's on site.

"She makes the kids happy...She's very creative, very imaginative."

Districtwide LVN Iridiana Leon considers herself fortunate to have Rachel by her side, speaking highly of her outgoing personality and genuine care and support.

"She's great to talk to. She makes the kids happy. She's very positive all the time. Always positive. She's very creative, very imaginative and I love [having her here.]"
