
- Student Transportation (ride time, availability, proximity)


Teaching & Learning: Redistricting

** Evergreen Elementary has capacity for additional sections if/when necessary.






Class Size

Due to our voterapproved referendum, ACSC class sizes are great. We plan to continue to meet these targets for the 2025-2026 school year.


2024-25 Class Sizes

Library Innovation






Encore Classes: Middle School, 6-8

Student Supports


The following program locations could be adjusted based on number of students that are enrolled.

- K-5 Strive Cedar, Hickory, River Birch, Willow
- 6-8 Strive AMS North, AMS West
- K-5 Impact Evergreen, Pine Tree, Sycamore
- 6-8 Impact AMS North, AMS South, AMS West

All schools will also provide special education Resource classrooms and supports for students who are Multilingual Learners.



Diotriot map






Redistricting Models

- You will have 15 minutes to review each model in small groups
 - A district administrator will be in each room to explain the model
 - Within each room are 3 locations to view the model (screen, easel, whiteboard) while the model is being explained
 - Each model consists of 1 middle school boundary and at least 1 elementary boundary these are a package
- Parameters
 - Keep neighborhoods together as much as possible
 - Keep variance in socio-economic status to 15% or less
 - Maintain balanced school size enrollment (500 600 elementary; 800 middle)
 - Maintain capacity for growth in all schools
 - No portable classrooms
 - Utilize instructional spaces for their original design (science labs, large group instruction, Outdoor Learning Center classroom, etc.)
- For time constraints, we have started a list of Strengths/Challenges for each model and will ask you to add to it
