2024-2025 SCHOOL PROFILE

Falmouth High School is a comprehensive public high school with an enrollment of approximately **670 students** in grades 9-12; the **Class of 2025 has 193 students**. FHS is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges and the Maine Department of Education.

Curriculum

FHS offers Advanced Placement (AP), Honors, and college preparatory level classes. 19 AP courses are currently offered to the class of 2025. Due to scheduling constraints it is not possible for a student to take all the AP courses offered in any given year.

Two dual enrollment courses are offered through partnership with Southern Maine Community College: “Quantitative Reasoning” and “English Comp/Intro to Lit 100-115.” Students also have the opportunity to take early college classes through the University of Maine system.

“Pop-Up” classes are quarter-credit elective courses offered in a variety of content areas. “If This Land Could Talk” is a 2-credit interdisciplinary class focused on the local environment covering both English and science standards. Students have access to Virtual High School (VHS) and other online courses at all levels, including AP. Portland Arts and Technology High School (PATHS) is also available and offers hands-on, technical, and career-focused education to FHS students. PATHS students are there for half a day and receive 4 credits for their PATHS program.

Diploma endorsements are offered in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics), and in Fine Arts (with strands in Music, Theater, and Visual Arts). These endorsements recognize students who pursue specific fields of study and activities in greater depth along a structured path.

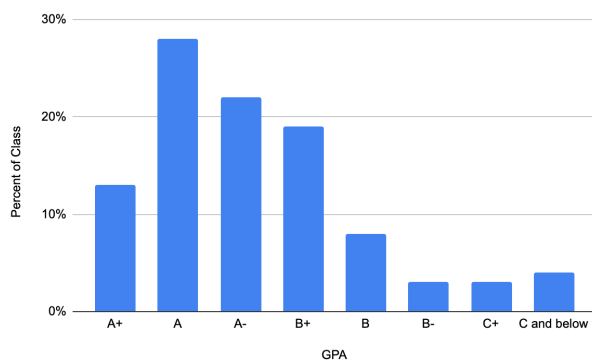
