Girls Cross-Country - The Chemic ladies continued a solid start to the 2024 season with a 4th-place finish in Friday's Oiler Invitational at Mount Pleasant. Emma McLaughlin and Sawyer Collins earned medalist honors with Addie Jones, Avery Shepard, and Hannah Murtha rounding out the scoring runners for the Chemics. Ella McLaughlin and Sophia Knarr also finished as the top seven runners for Midland to earn varsity status.

Boys Cross-Country - The boys cross-country team continued their strong start to the 2024 season with a 2nd place finish at last Friday's Oiler Invitational held in Mount Pleasant. All seven Chemic varsity runners finished with medalist honors including Andrew Worsley, Logan Bellinger, Cam Cochran, Spencer Porritt, Bo Brutyn, Connor Murphy, and Matthew Berg.

The Varsity Volleyball team competed at the Cadillac Volleyball Round Robin Invitational on Friday Aug. 30th, going 2-2 on the day. In the first match, Midland beat Morley Stanwood 25-17, 25-12; then lost a tight second match to Cadillac 25-22, 25-23. In the third match, Midland defeated McBain in another close match 27-25, 26-24. In the final match, Midland lost to Kingsley 25-14, 25-17. Nicole Giardina led with 33 kills, 29 digs, 7 aces; while Brooke Russell contributed 25 kills, 12 blocks. Running the offense, Payton Palmer contributed 78 assists, 20 digs, and 5 aces. Brigid O'Malley had 49 digs, and Bella Kroll added 24 digs. The team is 2-2 to start the season. Next match play is at Flushing tournament on Saturday September 7th.
